DISCRETIONARY LICENSE SUSPENSION SECTION 1.01. Subchapter A, Chapter 102, Code of Criminal 8 Procedure, is amended by adding Article 102.0179 to read as 9 10 follows: Art. 102.0179. FINE FOR CERTAIN DRUG AND TEXAS CONTROLLED 11 SUBSTANCE ACT CONVICTIONS. (a) In this article, "convicted" 12 includes an adjudication under juvenile proceedings. 13 14 (b) In addition to any other fees and fines imposed under 15 this subchapter, a defendant convicted of a misdemeanor drug offense as defined by Section 521.371, Transportation Code, whose 16 driver's license is not suspended under Section 521.372, 17 Transportation Code, as a result of that conviction, shall pay a 18 fine of \$100. 19 (c) The court shall waive imposition of a fine under this 20 article if the defendant's driver's license is suspended under 21 Section 521.372, Transportation Code, or under another provision of 22 that code as a result of the conviction of: 23 24 (1) an offense described by Section 521.372(a),

S.B. No. 181 1 Transportation Code; or 2 (2) another offense arising from the same criminal 3 episode. 4 (d) A fine imposed under this article is due regardless of whether the defendant is granted community supervision in the case. 5 The court shall collect the fine under this article in the same 6 7 manner as court costs are collected in the case. (e) A fine collected under this article shall be deposited 8 9 to the credit of the Texas mobility fund. The heading to Subchapter P, Chapter 521, 10 SECTION 1.02. 11 Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER P. [AUTOMATIC] SUSPENSION FOR CERTAIN DRUG OFFENSES 12 13 SECTION 1.03. Section 521.372, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 14 Sec. 521.372. [AUTOMATIC] SUSPENSION OR [+] LICENSE DENIAL. 15 16 (a) A person's driver's license is automatically suspended on final conviction of: 17 18 (1)an offense under the Controlled Substances Act; a felony drug offense; [or] 19 (2) a misdemeanor drug offense, if the person has been 20 (3) previously convicted of a drug offense committed less than 36 21 months before the commission of the instant offense; or 22 (4) a felony under Chapter 481, Health and Safety 23 24 Code, that is not a drug offense. 25 (b) The department may not issue a driver's license to a person convicted of an offense specified in Subsection (a) who, on 26 27 the date of the conviction, did not hold a driver's license.

1 (b-1) Except as provided by Subsection (a)(3), the court may
2 order that the department suspend the license of a person who holds
3 a license at the time of final conviction of a misdemeanor drug
4 offense if the court makes a written determination that the
5 suspension is in the interest of public safety.

6 (c) Except as provided by Section 521.374(b), the period of 7 suspension <u>or license denial</u> under this section is <u>90</u> [the 180] days 8 after the date of a final conviction[, and the period of license 9 denial is the 180 days after the date the person applies to the 10 department for reinstatement or issuance of a driver's license].

ARTICLE 2. EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

SECTION 2.01. Section 521.374(a), Transportation Code, as amended by Chapters 838 (S.B. 202), 851 (S.B. 1070), and 1004 (H.B. 4 642), Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:

16 (a) A person whose license is suspended under Section 17 521.372 may:

(1) <u>successfully complete</u> [attend] an <u>in-person or</u> <u>online</u> educational program, approved by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation [Department of State Health Services] under rules adopted by the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation [executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services <u>Commission</u>] and the department, that is designed to educate persons on the dangers of drug abuse; or

(2) successfully complete education on the dangers of
drug abuse approved by the Department of State Health Services as
equivalent to the educational program described by Subdivision (1),

while the person is a resident of a facility for the treatment of
 drug abuse or chemical dependency, including:

3 (A) a substance abuse treatment facility or
4 substance abuse felony punishment facility operated by the Texas
5 Department of Criminal Justice under Section 493.009, Government
6 Code;

7 (B) a community corrections facility, as defined8 by Section 509.001, Government Code; or

9 (C) a chemical dependency treatment facility 10 licensed under Chapter 464, Health and Safety Code.

11 SECTION 2.02. Section 521.374(b), Transportation Code, is 12 amended to read as follows:

(b) The period of suspension or prohibition under Section
521.372(c) continues <u>until the earlier of:</u>

15 (1) the date [for an indefinite period until] the 16 individual successfully completes the <u>in-person or online</u> educational program under Subsection (a)(1) or is released from the 17 residential treatment facility at which the individual 18 successfully completed equivalent education <u>under Subsection</u> 19 20 (a)(2), as applicable; or

(2) the second anniversary of the date the suspension
 or prohibition was imposed.

23 SECTION 2.03. Section 521.375, Transportation Code, as 24 amended by Chapters 838 (S.B. 202) and 851 (S.B. 1070), Acts of the 25 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is reenacted and amended 26 to read as follows:

27 Sec. 521.375. JOINT ADOPTION OF RULES. (a) The Texas

Commission of Licensing and Regulation and the department shall
 jointly adopt rules for the qualification and approval of providers
 of <u>in-person and online</u> educational programs under Section
 <u>521.374(a)(1)</u> [<u>521.374</u>].

5 <u>(a-1)</u> The executive commissioner of the Health and Human 6 Services Commission and the department shall jointly adopt rules 7 for the qualification and approval of [+

8 [(1) providers of educational programs under Section
9 521.374(a)(1); and

10 [(2)] equivalent education provided in a residential 11 treatment facility described by Section 521.374(a)(2).

(b) The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall
publish the jointly adopted rules <u>under Subsection (a)</u>.

16 SECTION 2.04. Section 521.376, Transportation Code, as 17 amended by Chapters 838 (S.B. 202) and 851 (S.B. 1070), Acts of the 18 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is reenacted and amended 19 to read as follows:

TRANSITION; EFFECTIVE DATE 21 22 SECTION 3.01. (a) Section 3, Chapter 710 (H.B. 162), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is repealed. 23 Section 521.293, Transportation Code, as amended by 24 (b) 25 Chapter 710 (H.B. 162), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, applies to a determination to suspend a driver's 26 27 license that is made by the Department of Public Safety of the State

1 of Texas before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

2 SECTION 3.02. Not later than September 1, 2022, the Texas 3 Commission of Licensing and Regulation and the Department of Public 4 Safety shall adopt rules to implement Sections 521.374, 521.375, 5 and 521.376, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act.

6 SECTION 3.03. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this 7 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

8 (b) Article 1 of this Act takes effect on the 91st day after 9 the date the office of the attorney general publishes in the Texas 10 Register a finding that:

(1) the legislature of this state has adopted a resolution expressing the legislature's opposition to a law meeting the requirements of 23 U.S.C. Section 159 in suspending, revoking, or denying the driver's license of a person convicted of a drug offense for a period of six months;

16 (2) the governor has submitted to the United States17 secretary of transportation:

(A) a written certification of the governor's
opposition to the enactment or enforcement of a law required under
23 U.S.C. Section 159; and

(B) a written certification that the legislature
has adopted the resolution described by Subdivision (1) of this
subsection; and

(3) the United States secretary of transportation has
responded to the governor's submission and certified that highway
funds will not be withheld from this state in response to the
modification or full or partial repeal of the law required under 23

1 U.S.C. Section 159.

2 (c) On the 180th day after the date described in Subsection
3 (b) of this section, the Department of Public Safety shall
4 reinstate any driver's license that:

5 (1) was suspended under Section 521.372, 6 Transportation Code, before the date described by Subsection (b) of 7 this section; and

8 (2) remains subject to suspension under that section 9 on the 180th day after the date described in Subsection (b) of this 10 section.
