- 8 Sec. 263.4011. RENDERING FINAL ORDER; EXTENSION. (a) On
- 9 timely commencement of the trial on the merits under Section
- 10 263.401, the court shall render a final order not later than the
- 11 90th day after the date the trial commences.
- 12 (b) The 90-day period for rendering a final order under
- 13 Subsection (a) is not tolled for any recess during the trial.
- 14 <u>(c) If the court finds that extraordinary circumstances</u>
- 15 necessitate extending the 90-day period under Subsection (a), the
- 16 court may grant one extension of that date for not longer than 30
- 17 days. The court shall render a written order:
- 18 (1) specifying the grounds on which the extension is
- 19 granted; and

- 20 (2) requiring a final order to be rendered not later
- 21 than the 30th day after the date the extension is granted.
- 22 (d) A party may file a mandamus proceeding if the court
- 23 fails to render a final order within the time required by this
- 24 section.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 263.4011, Family Code, as added by this
- 2 Act, applies only to a suit affecting the parent-child relationship
- 3 filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A suit affecting
- 4 the parent-child relationship filed before that date is governed by
- 5 the law in effect on the date the suit was filed, and that law is
- 6 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
