A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to expanding eligibility for medical assistance to certain
3	persons under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care
4	Act and ensuring the provision of quality care under and the
5	effectiveness of the medical assistance program.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, is amended by
8	adding Subchapter H to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER H. EXPANSION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
10	Sec. 32.351. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Medical assistance expansion group" means the
12	category of persons who would not be eligible for medical
13	assistance under the eligibility criteria in effect on December 31,
14	2021, but who are eligible for that assistance because of the
15	requirement of Section 32.352(a).
16	(2) "Undocumented immigrant" means a person who:
17	(A) is not a citizen or other national of the
18	United States; and
19	(B) is not lawfully authorized to be present in
20	the United States under the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
21	U.S.C. Section 1101 et seq.) or other federal law.
22	Sec. 32.352. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
23	UNDER PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT. (a)
2/1	Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided in Subsection

- 1 (b) and Section 32.353, to the extent money is appropriated to the
- 2 commission for that purpose, beginning January 1, 2022, the
- 3 commission shall provide medical assistance to all persons who
- 4 apply for that assistance and for whom federal matching money is
- 5 available under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act
- 6 (Pub. L. No. 111-148) as amended by the Health Care and Education
- 7 Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No. 111-152) to provide that
- 8 assistance.
- 9 <u>(b) Nothing in this section authorizes the commission to</u>
- 10 provide medical assistance to undocumented immigrants.
- 11 (c) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules regarding
- 12 the provision of medical assistance as required by this section.
- 13 Sec. 32.353. RESTRICTED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
- 14 ON CHANGES IN FEDERAL MATCHING MONEY. (a) Notwithstanding any
- 15 other law, if the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) by
- 16 which this state's expenditures under the medical assistance
- 17 program are matched with federal money, and that applies with
- 18 respect to persons in the medical assistance expansion group, is
- 19 less than the percentage provided for in the Patient Protection and
- 20 Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. No. 111-148) as amended by the Health
- 21 Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No.
- 22 111-152), excluding subsequent amendments:
- 23 (1) the commission shall alert the Legislative Budget
- 24 Board; and
- 25 (2) beginning on the first day of the month following
- 26 the month in which the new federal medical assistance percentage
- 27 (FMAP) becomes effective, the commission shall:

1	(A) cease providing medical assistance to
2	persons in the medical assistance expansion group; and
3	(B) reinstate the eligibility criteria for
4	medical assistance that existed on December 31, 2021.
5	(b) The executive commissioner shall adopt any rules
6	necessary to implement any changes in the provision of and
7	eligibility criteria for medical assistance required by this
8	section.
9	Sec. 32.354. FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF
10	COST-SHARING OBLIGATIONS FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE EXPANSION GROUP.
11	The executive commissioner shall seek a waiver or other appropriate
12	authorization from the appropriate federal agency to develop and
13	implement cost-sharing obligations for the medical assistance
14	expansion group. Cost-sharing obligations developed by the
15	<pre>commission under this section:</pre>
16	(1) must be designed to:
17	(A) incentivize persons in the medical
18	assistance expansion group to seek preventive or routine health
19	care services, rather than emergency health care services, when
20	possible and appropriate; and
21	(B) guarantee quality health care for persons in
22	the medical assistance expansion group;
23	(2) may include:
24	(A) copayments and deductibles; and
25	(B) modifications to the reimbursement
26	methodologies for services provided to persons in the medical
27	assistance expansion group; and

1	(3) may incorporate any other incentives or strategies
2	that the commission determines are necessary, including:
3	(A) expanded use of managed care;
4	(B) increased reliance on private individual or
5	<pre>employer-based health benefits coverage;</pre>
6	(C) incentives and rewards for participation in
7	evidence-based wellness activities; and
8	(D) targeted benefits for chronic illnesses.
9	Sec. 32.355. ANNUAL REPORT ON EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR
10	MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. Not later than December 1 of each year, the
11	commission shall report to the governor, the lieutenant governor,
12	the speaker of the house of representatives, and the standing
13	committees of the senate and the house of representatives having
14	primary jurisdiction over the medical assistance program on the
15	effects of expanding eligibility for medical assistance under
16	Section 32.352, including the effects on:
17	(1) the number of persons in this state who do not have
18	health benefits coverage;
19	(2) state health care costs, including costs relating
20	to programs funded with money appropriated out of the general
21	revenue fund;
22	(3) local health care costs; and
23	(4) charity care and uncompensated care costs for
24	hospitals.
25	SECTION 2. Section 32.352, Human Resources Code, as added
26	by this Act, applies only to an initial determination or
27	recertification of eligibility of a person for medical assistance

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- 1 under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, made on or after January 1,
- 2 2022, regardless of the date the person applied for that
- 3 assistance.
- 4 SECTION 3. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 5 this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 6 Services Commission shall take all necessary actions to expand
- 7 eligibility for medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human
- 8 Resources Code, beginning January 1, 2022, and in accordance with
- 9 Section 32.352, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act,
- 10 including:
- 11 (1) notifying appropriate federal agencies of that
- 12 expanded eligibility; and
- 13 (2) establishing work groups or consulting with
- 14 stakeholder groups.
- 15 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 16 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 17 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 18 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 19 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 20 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
