## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of certain child-care facilities and
3	family homes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as Ellie's Law.
6	SECTION 2. Section 42.025, Human Resources Code, is amended
7	to read as follows:
8	Sec. 42.025. SEARCHABLE DATABASE. (a) The <u>commission</u>
9	[department] shall permanently maintain on the commission's
10	[department's] Internet website a searchable database that <u>lists</u>
11	[includes the name, the address, and any identification number, as
12	applicable, of each group day-care home and family home licensed,
13	registered, or listed under this chapter:
14	(1) that previously had a <u>license</u> , registration, or
15	listing <u>under this chapter</u> involuntarily suspended or revoked; or
16	(2) for which the commission refused to renew a
17	license, registration, or listing [under this chapter with a
18	permanent notation indicating the involuntary suspension or
19	revocation and the year in which the suspension or revocation took
20	effect or was final under this chapter].
21	(b) The database maintained under Subsection (a) must
22	include for each group day-care home and licensed or registered

(1) the name of the facility;

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family home:

- 1 (2) the address of the facility, including the county
- 2 in which the facility is located;
- 3 (3) any identification number associated with the
- 4 facility;
- 5 (4) the name of the sole proprietor or each partner who
- 6 owns the child-care operation or, if the owner is a business entity,
- 7 the name of each officer responsible for the management of the
- 8 child-care operation as determined by the commissioner; and
- 9 (5) the year in which:
- 10 (A) the involuntary suspension or revocation of
- 11 the facility's license, registration, or listing took effect or was
- 12 final under this chapter; or
- 13 (B) the commission refused to renew the
- 14 facility's license, registration, or listing.
- 15 (c) The commission shall include the name of each individual
- 16 described by Subsection (b)(4) who is associated with the license,
- 17 registration, or listing in any database entry made under this
- 18 section.
- 19 (d) The executive commissioner may adopt rules as necessary
- 20 to implement this section.
- 21 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
- 22 is amended by adding Section 42.04291 to read as follows:
- Sec. 42.04291. SUPERVISION STANDARDS FOR INFANT DURING TIME
- 24 SPENT ON STOMACH. The executive commissioner by rule shall
- 25 establish standards for the visual and auditory supervision of an
- 26 <u>infant engaged in time on the infant's stomach while awake. Each</u>
- 27 group day-care home and listed and registered family home shall

- 1 comply with the supervision standards.
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 42.046, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 3 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 (a) An applicant for a license to operate a child-care
- 6 facility, child-placing agency, or continuum-of-care residential
- 7 operation or for a listing or registration to operate a family home
- 8 shall submit to the commission [department] the appropriate fee
- 9 prescribed by Section 42.054 and a completed application on a form
- 10 provided by the commission [department].
- 11 <u>(a-1)</u> The commission shall require the applicant for a
- 12 license, registration, or listing for a group day-care home or a
- 13 <u>family home to provide the applicant's name and the name of the sole</u>
- 14 proprietor or each partner who owns the child-care operation or, if
- 15 the owner is a business entity, the name of each officer responsible
- 16 for the management of the child-care operation as determined by the
- 17 commissioner on the application form.
- SECTION 5. Section 42.048, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 19 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 20 (a-1) The commission shall associate a license issued under
- 21 this chapter for a group day-care home with the applicant's name as
- 22 stated in the applicant's license application.
- SECTION 6. Section 42.050(c), Human Resources Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- (c) The commission shall evaluate the application for
- 26 renewal of a license to determine if all licensing requirements are
- 27 met and whether the facility has been cited for repeated violations

- 1 or has established a pattern of violations during the preceding
- 2 <u>five</u> [two] years. The evaluation may include a specified number of
- 3 visits to the facility and must include a review of all required
- 4 forms and records. If the commission determines the facility has
- 5 repeated violations or an established pattern of violations, before
- 6 the commission renews the license the commission may place
- 7 restrictions, conditions, or additional requirements on the
- 8 license to ensure the violations cease.
- 9 SECTION 7. Section 42.052, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 10 by adding Subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 11 <u>(1) The commission shall associate a listing or</u>
- 12 registration of a family home issued under this chapter with the
- 13 applicant's name as stated in the applicant's listing or
- 14 registration application.
- SECTION 8. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
- 16 is amended by adding Section 42.0562 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 42.0562. INFORMATION REGARDING CERTAIN GROUP DAY-CARE
- 18 HOME AND FAMILY HOME EMPLOYEES. (a) The commission shall collect
- 19 information regarding group day-care home and family home employees
- 20 who have had a license, registration, or other occupational
- 21 authorization revoked by a licensing authority.
- 22 (b) The commission shall collaborate with licensing
- 23 <u>authorities to determine the most efficient method for identifying</u>
- 24 group day-care home or family home employees who have had a license
- 25 revoked by the licensing authority.
- 26 (c) In this section:
- 27 (1) "License" means a license, registration,

- 1 certificate, permit, or other authorization issued by a licensing
- 2 authority that a person must obtain to practice or engage in a
- 3 particular business, occupation, or profession.
- 4 (2) "Licensing authority" means a department,
- 5 commission, board, office, or other agency of the state that issues
- 6 <u>a license.</u>
- 7 SECTION 9. The executive commissioner of the Health and
- 8 Human Services Commission is required to implement this Act only if
- 9 the legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose.
- 10 If the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that
- 11 purpose, the executive commissioner may, but is not required to,
- 12 implement this Act using other appropriations available for the
- 13 purpose.
- 14 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
