- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 54.5001 to read as follows:
- 6
- Sec. 54.5001. LIMITATIONS ON FEE INCREASES WITHOUT STUDENT 7
- APPROVAL. (a) In this section, "general academic teaching 8
- institution" and "public state college" have the meanings assigned 9
- by Section 61.003. 10

- 11 (b) This section applies only to a general academic teaching
- 12 institution other than a public state college.
- (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter 13
- 14 or other law and except as provided by Subsection (d), the governing
- board of an institution to which this section applies may not 15
- 16 increase the amount of a fee charged under this subchapter to an
- amount that is greater than the amount charged by the institution in 17
- the preceding academic year as adjusted for inflation according to 18
- the inflation rate determined under Subsection (e). 19
- 20 (c-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (c) and except as provided
- by Subsection (d), for the 2021-2022 academic year, the amount of a 21
- fee charged under this subchapter by an institution to which this 22
- 23 section applies may not exceed the amount of the fee charged by that
- institution under this subchapter in the 2020-2021 academic year, 24

- 1 if the institution charged the fee in that academic year, except
- 2 that if the institution's governing board, before January 1, 2021,
- 3 gave final approval to an increase in the fee to be charged for the
- 4 2021-2022 academic year, the institution may charge the fee for
- 5 that year at that increased rate. This subsection expires
- 6 <u>September 1, 2022.</u>
- 7 (d) Subsection (c) does not apply to an increase in the
- 8 amount of a fee if the increase is approved by a vote of the students
- 9 of the institution voting in a student election authorized by law
- 10 for that purpose.
- 11 (e) Not later than January 31 of each year, or as soon
- 12 thereafter as practicable, the Legislative Budget Board shall
- 13 publish and certify to the governing board of each general academic
- 14 teaching institution other than a public state college the
- 15 inflation rate to be used for purposes of this section for the next
- 16 <u>academic year.</u> The inflation rate is the percentage increase, if
- 17 any, as expressed in decimal form rounded to the nearest thousandth
- 18 of one percent, in the consumer price index, as defined by Section
- 19 341.201, Finance Code, for the preceding calendar year as compared
- 20 to the consumer price index for the year preceding that year.
- 21 (e-1) For purposes of applying this section for the
- 22 2021-2022 academic year, the Legislative Budget Board shall publish
- 23 and certify the applicable inflation rate as soon as practicable
- 24 after this section takes effect. This subsection expires September
- 25 1, 2022.
- 26 (f) This section does not:
- 27 (1) provide independent authority for the governing

- 1 board of an institution to which this section applies to increase
- 2 the amount of a fee or to call a student election to approve an
- 3 <u>increase in the amount of a fee; or</u>
- 4 (2) authorize the governing board of an institution to
- 5 which this section applies to increase the amount of a fee charged
- 6 under this subchapter to an amount that exceeds the maximum amount
- 7 prescribed by the law authorizing the fee's imposition, if that law
- 8 prescribes a maximum amount.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 54.5001, Education Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, applies beginning with fee increases for the 2021 fall
- 11 semester.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
