- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 110.001(a), Civil Practices and Remedies
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Subdivisions (3) and (4) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 <u>(3) "Place of worship" means a building or grounds</u>
- 9 where religious activities are conducted.
- 10 (4) "Public official" means any elected or appointed
- 11 officer, employee, or agent of the state or any political
- 12 subdivision, board, commission, bureau, or other public body
- 13 established by law.
- 14 SECTION 2. Amend Section 110.002, Civil Practices and
- 15 Remedies Code, to read as follows:
- Sec. 110.002. APPLICATION. (a) This chapter applies to any
- 17 ordinance, rule, order, decision, practice, or other exercise of
- 18 governmental authority.
- 19 (b) This chapter applies to an act of a government agency,
- 20 in the exercise of governmental authority, granting or refusing to
- 21 grant a government benefit to an individual.
- (c) This chapter applies to each law of this state unless
- 23 the law is expressly made exempt from the application of this
- 24 chapter by reference to this chapter.

- 1 (d) For purposes of a disaster as defined by Sec. 418.004,
- 2 Government Code:
- 3 (1) this chapter is not considered a regulatory
- 4 statute; and
- 5 (2) a provision of this chapter may not be suspended.
- 6 SECTION 3. Amend Chapter 110, Civil Practices and Remedies
- 7 Code, by adding Section 110.0031 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 110.0031. PROHIBITION ON CLOSING PLACES OF WORSHIP. A
- 9 government agency or public official may not issue an order that
- 10 closes or has the effect of closing places of worship in the state
- 11 or in a geographic area of the state.
- 12 SECTION 4. Amend Sec. 110.004, Civil Practices and Remedies
- 13 Code, to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 110.004. DEFENSE. A person whose free exercise of
- 15 religion has been substantially burdened in violation of Section
- 16 110.003 and 110.0031 may assert that violation as a defense in a
- 17 judicial or administrative proceeding without regard to whether the
- 18 proceeding is brought in the name of the state or by any other
- 19 person.
- 20 SECTION 5. Chapter 110, Civil Practices and Remedies Code,
- 21 as added by this Act, applies only to a claim that accrues on or
- 22 after the effective date of this Act. A claim that accrued before
- 23 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 24 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 25 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 26 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
