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- 2 relating to training requirements and prohibited discrimination

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 42.042(e), Human Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (e) The executive commissioner shall promulgate minimum
- 8 standards that apply to licensed child-care facilities and to
- 9 registered family homes covered by this chapter and that will:
- 10 (1) promote the health, safety, and welfare of
- 11 children attending a facility or registered family home;
- 12 (2) promote safe, comfortable, and healthy physical
- 13 facilities and registered family homes for children;
- 14 (3) ensure adequate supervision of children by
- 15 capable, qualified, and healthy personnel;
- 16 (4) ensure adequate and healthy food service where
- 17 food service is offered;
- 18 (5) prohibit [racial] discrimination based on race or
- 19 disability by child-care facilities and registered family homes;
- 20 (6) require procedures for parental and quardian
- 21 consultation in the formulation of children's educational and
- 22 therapeutic programs;
- 23 (7) prevent the breakdown of foster care and adoptive
- 24 placement; and

1	(8) ensure that a child-care facility or registered
2	family home:
3	(A) follows the directions of a child's physician
4	or other health care provider in providing specialized medical
5	assistance required by the child; and
6	(B) maintains for a reasonable time a copy of any
7	directions from the physician or provider that the parent provides
8	to the facility or home.
9	SECTION 2. Section 42.0421, Human Resources Code, is
10	amended by adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:
11	(a-1) The initial training described by Subsection (a)(1)
12	must include training on:
13	(1) trauma-informed care; and
14	(2) behavioral health that includes:
15	(A) methods for:
16	(i) understanding and managing behaviors;
17	(ii) requesting a behavioral health
18	<pre>consultation; and</pre>
19	(iii) providing behavioral health support
20	to all children who are provided care; and
21	(B) a description of the impact autism and other
22	intellectual and developmental disabilities have on behavior and
23	<pre>communication.</pre>
24	(a-2) The annual training described by Subsection (a)(2)
25	must include training on care provided to children with special
26	<pre>needs and methods for:</pre>
27	(1) identifying possible developmental delays;

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- 1 (2) locating community resources for the children;
- 2 (3) providing effective communication to the
- 3 children's parents; and
- 4 (4) accommodating the special needs of children in the
- 5 <u>classroom.</u>
- 6 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 7 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 8 Services Commission shall adopt the rules necessary to implement
- 9 the changes in law made by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
