- 2 relating to the ability of certain relative caretakers of dependent
- 3 children to receive supplemental financial assistance and be
- 4 assigned as protective payees for financial assistance payments.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 31.0041(a), Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) To the extent funds are appropriated for this purpose,
- 9 the commission may provide supplemental financial assistance in
- 10 addition to the amount of financial assistance granted for the
- 11 support of a dependent child under Section 31.003 to a person who:
- 12 (1) is 25 [45] years of age or older;
- 13 (2) is the grandparent, aunt, uncle, sister, or
- 14 brother of the dependent child, as defined by Section 31.002, who
- 15 lives at the person's residence;
- 16 (3) is the primary caretaker of the dependent child;
- 17 (4) has a family income that is at or below 200 percent
- 18 of the federal poverty level; and
- 19 (5) does not have resources that exceed the amount
- 20 allowed for financial assistance under this chapter.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 31.0324, Human Resources Code, is
- 22 amended by amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection
- 23 (d) to read as follows:
- 24 (b) The executive commissioner by rule shall develop and the

- 1 commission shall implement a process that provides for the
- 2 grandparent, aunt, uncle, sister, or brother of a child receiving
- 3 financial assistance under this chapter to serve as a protective
- 4 payee to:
- 5 (1) receive and use the assistance on behalf of the
- 6 child; and
- 7 (2) apply for financial assistance and be interviewed
- 8 instead of the child's parent at any subsequent review of
- 9 eligibility required by the commission.
- 10 (c) The commission shall limit the use of the process
- 11 established by Subsection (b) to situations in which the commission
- 12 determines the parent is not using the assistance for the child's
- 13 needs as required by Section 31.0355(a), and the executive
- 14 commissioner shall establish by rule the circumstances under which
- 15 the grandparent, aunt, uncle, sister, or brother may be removed as a
- 16 protective payee.
- 17 <u>(d) To serve as a protective payee of a child receiving</u>
- 18 financial assistance under this chapter, a person described by
- 19 Subsection (b) must be at least 25 years of age.
- 20 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
- 21 person receiving financial assistance under Chapter 31, Human
- 22 Resources Code, on or after the effective date of this Act,
- 23 regardless of the date on which eligibility for the financial
- 24 assistance was determined.
- 25 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 26 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 27 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,

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- 1 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 2 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 3 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
