4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:									
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 242, Health and Safety									
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 242.020 to read as follows:									
7	Sec. 242.020. CIVIL LIABILITY RELATED TO MISAPPROPRIATION									
8	OF RESIDENT'S FUNDS. (a) In this section:									
9	(1) "Misappropriate" means the taking, secretion,									
10	misapplication, deprivation, transfer, or attempted transfer to									
11	any person not entitled to receive any real or personal property or									
12	anything of value belonging to or under the legal control of a									
13	resident without the effective consent of the resident or other									
14	appropriate legal authority.									
15	(2) "Responsible payor" means a person who:									
16	(A) has legal access to the resident's income or									
17	resources available to pay for nursing facility care; and									
18	(B) has signed an admission agreement or other									
19	contract with the facility in which the person agrees to provide									
20	payment for the resident's facility care from the resident's income									
21	or resources.									
22	(b) A nursing facility may file an action against a									
23	resident's responsible payor for an amount owed by the resident to									
24	the facility if:									

- 1 (1) before admission of the resident, the facility
- 2 obtains financial information from the resident or responsible
- 3 payor demonstrating the amount of financial resources that the
- 4 resident has available to pay for nursing facility care; and
- 5 (2) after the resident begins to reside at the
- 6 facility, the responsible payor misappropriates the resident's
- 7 resources to a degree that the resident is unable to afford to pay
- 8 for the resident's care.
- 9 <u>(c) A nursing facility may file an action for injunctive</u>
- 10 relief against a resident's responsible payor who engages in
- 11 conduct described by Subsection (b). The court may grant any
- 12 appropriate injunctive relief to prevent or abate the conduct,
- 13 including a temporary restraining order, temporary injunction, or
- 14 permanent injunction.
- 15 <u>(d) Subject to Subsection (e), the prevailing party in an</u>
- 16 action filed under this section may recover attorney's fees.
- 17 (e) In an action filed under this section, a nursing
- 18 facility may not recover a total amount, including damages and
- 19 attorney's fees, that exceeds the amount the responsible payor has
- 20 misappropriated from the resident.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 242.020, Health and Safety Code, as
- 22 added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues on
- 23 or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
