- 5 SECTION 1. Section 78.002, Government Code, is amended by
- amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 6

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- The committee shall provide oversight and strategic 8
- 9 guidance to the office of capital and forensic writs, including:
- (1) recommending [recommend] to the court of criminal 10
- 11 appeals as provided by Section 78.004 a director for the office of

- 14 (2) setting policy for the office of capital and

- 18 (c) The committee may not access privileged or confidential

- SECTION 2. Section 78.003, Government Code, is amended by 20
- 21 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (a-1),
- 22 (a-2), and (a-3) to read as follows:
- (a) The committee is composed of the following seven [five] 23
- members who are appointed as follows [by the president of the State 24

- 1 Bar of Texas, with ratification by the executive committee of the
- 2 State Bar of Texas]:
- 3 (1) three attorneys who are appointed by the executive
- 4 director of the Texas Indigent Defense Commission [members of the
- 5 State Bar of Texas and who are not employed as prosecutors or law
- 6 enforcement officials, all of whom must have criminal defense
- 7 experience with death penalty proceedings in this state]; [and]
- 8 (2) two attorneys who are appointed by the president
- 9 of the State Bar of Texas, with ratification by the executive
- 10 committee of the State Bar of Texas; and
- 11 (3) two attorneys, each of whom are appointed by a
- 12 majority of the deans of the public law schools in this state [two
- 13 state district judges, one of whom serves as presiding judge of an
- 14 administrative judicial region].
- 15 <u>(a-1)</u> Each member of the committee must be a licensed
- 16 attorney and must have significant experience in capital defense or
- 17 indigent criminal defense policy or practice. A member of the
- 18 committee may not be a prosecutor, a law enforcement official, a
- 19 judge of a court that presides over criminal offenses, or an
- 20 employee of the office of capital and forensic writs.
- 21 (a-2) Members of the committee serve four-year terms and may
- 22 be reappointed.
- 23 <u>(a-3)</u> If a vacancy occurs, the appropriate appointing
- 24 authority shall appoint a person to serve for the remainder of the
- 25 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 26 (c) The committee shall meet [members serve at the pleasure
- 27 of the president of the State Bar of Texas, and the committee meets]
