4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 25.087, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (b-7) and amending Subsection (d) to read as
7	follows:
8	(b-7) A school district may excuse a student who is 15 years
9	of age or older from attending school to visit a driver's license
10	office to obtain a driver's license or learner license, provided
11	that:
12	(1) the district may not excuse more than one day of
13	school during the period the student is enrolled in high school for
14	each of the following purposes:
15	(A) obtaining a driver's license; or
16	(B) obtaining a learner license; and
17	(2) the district verifies the student's visit to the
18	driver's license office in accordance with procedures adopted by
19	the district.
20	(d) A student whose absence is excused under Subsection (b),
21	$(b-1)$, $(b-2)$, $(b-4)$, $(b-5)$, $\underline{(b-7)}$, or (c) may not be penalized for
22	that absence and shall be counted as if the student attended school
23	for purposes of calculating the average daily attendance of
24	students in the school district. A student whose absence is excused

- 1 under Subsection (b), (b-1), (b-2), (b-4), (b-5), (b-7), or (c)
- 2 shall be allowed a reasonable time to make up school work missed on
- 3 those days. If the student satisfactorily completes the school
- 4 work, the day of absence shall be counted as a day of compulsory
- 5 attendance.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
