## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to required cardiopulmonary resuscitation training for
3	certain telecommunicators.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1701.352, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:
7	(j) The commission shall require a state, county, special
8	district, or municipal agency that employs telecommunicators to
9	require each telecommunicator who provides dispatch for medical
10	emergencies to receive training, including continuing education
11	training, in telecommunicator cardiopulmonary resuscitation. A
12	telecommunicator shall complete initial training not later than the
13	60th day after the telecommunicator's first date of employment with
14	the entity. A telecommunicator shall complete continuing education
15	training at least as often as nationally recognized standards for
16	telecommunicator cardiopulmonary resuscitation training are
17	updated. The training must:
18	(1) use the most current nationally recognized
19	emergency cardiovascular care guidelines;
20	(2) incorporate recognition protocols for
21	out-of-hospital cardiac arrest; and
22	(3) provide information on best practices for relaying
23	compression-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation instructions to
24	<u>callers.</u>

- 1 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 2 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt
- 3 rules necessary to implement Section 1701.352(j), Occupations
- 4 Code, as added by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
