2	relating to training requirements for public school board of
3	trustees members and superintendents regarding the adoption of a
4	trauma-informed school standard.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 11, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 11.004 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 11.004. TRAINING FOR SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS AND
9	SUPERINTENDENTS REGARDING TRAUMA-INFORMED SCHOOL STANDARD. (a) A
10	member of the board of trustees and the superintendent of a school
11	district must complete an agency-approved course of instruction
12	regarding the adoption and administration of a trauma-informed
13	school standard. A course required under this section must be
14	completed on an annual basis.
15	(b) A course of instruction described by Subsection (a) must
16	provide information, relevant to and within the scope of the duties
17	of a school board member or superintendent, regarding:
18	(1) recognition of and care for trauma in students and
19	educators;
20	(2) the relationship between educator wellness and
21	student learning;
22	(3) the effect of trauma on student behavior and
23	<pre>learning;</pre>
24	(4) the prevalence of trauma among students, including

- 1 the prevalence of trauma among student populations at higher risk
- 2 of experiencing trauma;
- 3 (5) the effects of implicit or explicit bias on
- 4 recognizing trauma among various racial or ethnic groups of
- 5 students; and
- 6 (6) effective district and campus policies and
- 7 practices shown to:
- 8 (A) prevent and mitigate the negative effect of
- 9 trauma on student behavior and learning; and
- 10 (B) support the emotional wellness of educators.
- 11 (c) A school district shall submit for agency approval any
- 12 course of instruction identified by the district as satisfying the
- 13 requirements of Subsection (b).
- 14 (d) The agency may approve both in-person and online courses
- 15 of instruction to satisfy the requirements of this section,
- 16 including courses provided by community-based nonprofit
- 17 organizations with expertise concerning trauma-informed school
- 18 standards.
- 19 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas
- 20 Education Agency shall approve one or more courses of instruction
- 21 to satisfy the training requirements of Section 11.004, Education
- 22 Code, as added by this Act.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
