A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to a state plan for responding to pandemics.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 418.0423 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 418.0423. PANDEMIC RESPONSE PLAN. (a) In this
7	section, "pandemic" means an emerging infectious disease threat
8	that has been declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization.
9	(b) The division shall prepare and keep current a pandemic
10	response plan. The plan may include provisions for:
11	(1) consulting infectious disease experts regarding:
12	(A) risk assessment;
13	(B) identification of the pathogen; and
14	(C) key questions about the pathogen that may
15	affect the size, scale, and design of the response;
16	(2) preventing and minimizing injury and damage caused
17	by a pandemic;
18	(3) prompt and effective response to a pandemic;
19	(4) emergency relief;
20	(5) identifying areas and populations particularly
21	vulnerable to the occurrence of a pandemic;
22	(6) communicating with governmental and private
23	entities, including entities listed in Section 418.051, to
24	facilitate coordination and collaboration for the efficient and

- 1 <u>effective planning and execution of a pandemic response plan;</u>
- 2 (7) organizing federal, state, and local pandemic
- 3 response activities;
- 4 (8) assisting local officials in designing local
- 5 pandemic response plans;
- 6 (9) preparing and distributing to appropriate state
- 7 and local officials catalogs of federal, state, and private
- 8 assistance programs; and
- 9 (10) other necessary matters relating to pandemics.
- 10 (c) In preparing and revising the pandemic response plan,
- 11 the division shall seek the assistance of:
- 12 <u>(1) any necessary federal, state, or local</u>
- 13 governmental entity;
- 14 (2) medical experts specializing in infectious
- 15 disease; and
- 16 (3) community leaders and business, labor,
- 17 agriculture, civic, and volunteer organizations.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
