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## S.B. No. 452

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to prevention and early intervention programs and 3 practices.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 264.201(d), Family Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (d) The services may include in-home programs, parenting 8 skills training, youth coping skills, and individual and family counseling. If the department requires or a court orders parenting 9 10 skills training services through a parenting education program or 11 practice, the program or practice must be an evidence-based program or practice, promising [practice parenting education] program or 12 practice, or evidence-informed program or practice described by 13 Section 265.151 that is provided in the community in which the 14 family resides, if available. 15

SECTION 2. Section 265.004(a-1), Family Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a-1) The department shall ensure that not less than 75 18 percent of the money appropriated for home visitation programs and 19 20 parenting education programs under Subsection (a) funds or practices 21 evidence-based programs described by Section 22 265.151(b) and that the remainder of that money funds promising [practice] programs or practices described by Section 265.151(c) or 23 24 evidence-informed programs or practices described by Section

rigorous, random, controlled research trial across heterogeneous 1 2 populations or communities with research results that have been published in a peer-reviewed journal]; 3 4 (5) substantially complies with a program or practice manual or design that specifies the purpose, outcomes, duration, 5 and frequency of the program or practice services; [and] 6 7 (6) employs well-trained and competent staff and provides continual relevant professional development opportunities 8 9 to the staff; 10 (7) is associated with a national organization, institution of higher education, or national or state public health 11 12 institute; and 13 (8) demonstrates substantial connections to other community-based\_services. 14 15 (C) A promising [<del>practice</del>] program or practice is а 16 [parenting education] program or practice that: 17 (1) has an active impact evaluation of the program or 18 practice or demonstrates a schedule for implementing an active impact evaluation of the program or practice; 19 is listed as a promising program or practice by a 20 (2) nationally recognized clearinghouse associated with a state or 21 22 federal agency or an institution of higher education or, during the preceding 10 years, has been subject to an external evaluation that 23 showed positive results and was published in peer-reviewed 24 25 literature [has been evaluated by at least one outcome-based study demonstrating effectiveness or random, controlled trial 26 in 27 homogeneous sample];

(3) substantially complies with a program <u>or practice</u>
 manual or design that specifies the purpose, outcomes, duration,
 and frequency of the program or practice services;

4 (4) employs well-trained and competent staff and 5 provides continual relevant professional development opportunities 6 to the staff; [and]

7 (5) is research-based and grounded in relevant, 8 empirical knowledge and program- or practice-determined 9 [program-determined] outcomes; and

10 (6) demonstrates substantial connections to other 11 <u>community-based services</u>.

12 (d) An evidence-informed program or practice is a program or 13 practice that:

14 (1) combines well-researched interventions with 15 clinical experience and ethics, and client preferences and culture, 16 to guide and inform the delivery of treatments and services;

17 (2) has an active impact evaluation of the program or 18 practice or demonstrates a schedule for implementing an active 19 impact evaluation of the program or practice;

20 (3) substantially complies with a program or practice 21 manual or design that specifies the purpose, outcome, duration, and 22 frequency of the program or practice services; and

23 (4) employs well-trained and competent staff and 24 provides continual relevant professional development opportunities 25 to the staff.

26 SECTION 6. Section 265.152, Family Code, is amended to read 27 as follows:

1 Sec. 265.152. OUTCOMES OF EVIDENCE-BASED PREVENTION AND EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES [PARENTING EDUCATION]. 2 3 The department shall ensure that а prevention and early intervention [parenting education] program or practice provided 4 under this subchapter [chapter] achieves favorable behavioral 5 outcomes in at least two of the following areas: 6 7 (1)improved cognitive development of children; (2) increased [<del>school</del>] 8 readiness for and 9 participation and performance in school [of children]; 10 reduced child abuse, neglect, and injury; (3) improved child safety; 11 (4) improved social-emotional development of children 12 (5) 13 and youth; (6) increased protective factors [improved parenting 14 15 skills], including nurturing, [and] bonding, and other parenting 16 skills; 17 (7) improved family economic self-sufficiency; 18 (8) reduced parental or youth involvement with the criminal justice system; [and] 19 20 (9) increased paternal involvement and support; (10) improved maternal and child health; and 21 22 (11) increased protective factors for children and youth. 23 SECTION 7. Section 265.153, Family Code, is amended to read 24 25 as follows: Sec. 265.153. EVALUATION 26 OF PREVENTION AND EARLY 27 INTERVENTION PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES [EVIDENCE-BASED PARENTING

1 EDUCATION]. (a) The department shall adopt outcome indicators to 2 measure the effectiveness of <u>prevention and early intervention</u> 3 [parenting education] programs <u>and practices</u> provided under this 4 <u>subchapter</u> [chapter] in achieving desired outcomes.

5 (b) The department may work directly with the model 6 developer of a <u>prevention and early intervention</u> [<del>parenting</del> 7 <u>education</u>] program <u>or practice</u> to identify appropriate outcome 8 indicators for the program <u>or practice</u> and to ensure that the 9 program <u>or practice</u> substantially complies with the model.

10 (c) The department shall develop internal processes to 11 share information with <u>prevention and early intervention service</u> 12 <u>providers</u> [<del>parenting education programs</del>] to assist the department 13 in analyzing the performance of the programs <u>or practices</u>.

14 (d) The department shall use information obtained under 15 this section to:

16 (1) monitor <u>prevention</u> and <u>early</u> intervention 17 [<del>parenting education</del>] programs <u>and practices</u>;

18 (2) continually improve the quality of the programs
19 <u>and practices</u>; and

20 (3) evaluate the effectiveness of the programs <u>and</u>
21 <u>practices</u>.

22 SECTION 8. Section 265.154, Family Code, is amended to read 23 as follows:

Sec. 265.154. REPORTS TO LEGISLATURE. (a) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the department shall prepare and submit a report on state-funded <u>prevention and early</u> <u>intervention</u> [parenting education] programs <u>and practices</u> to the

1 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
2 jurisdiction over child protective services.

3 (b) A report submitted under this section must include:

4 (1) a description of the <u>prevention and early</u> 5 <u>intervention</u> [parenting education] programs <u>and practices</u> 6 implemented and of the models associated with the programs <u>and</u> 7 <u>practices</u>;

8 (2) information on the families served by the programs 9 <u>and practices</u>, including the number of families served and their 10 demographic information;

11 (3) the goals and achieved outcomes of the <u>implemented</u> 12 programs <u>and practices</u>;

13 (4) information on the cost for each family served, 14 including any available third-party return-on-investment analysis; 15 and

16 (5) information explaining the percentage of money 17 spent on evidence-based programs and <u>practices</u>, on promising 18 [<del>practice</del>] programs <u>and practices</u>, <u>and on evidence-informed</u> 19 <u>programs and practices</u>.

20SECTION 9. Section 265.151(a), Family Code, is repealed.21SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
