- 8 INSTRUCTION. (a) In this section, "virtual instruction" means
- 9 instructional activities delivered to students primarily over the

- 11 (b) If a school district provides notice to the parent or
- 12 person standing in parental relation to a student enrolled in the
- 13 <u>district of the district's intent to offer only virtual instruction</u>
- 14 for more than one grading period during a school year, the student
- 15 may transfer for that school year to another school district that:
- 16 (1) offers in-person instruction during that school
- 17 year; and
- 18 (2) accepts the student's transfer.
- 19 <u>(c)</u> A student who transfers to another school district under
- 20 this section may not be charged tuition. The student is included in
- 21 the average daily attendance of the district in which the student
- 22 <u>attends school</u>.
- 23 (d) The commissioner may adopt rules necessary to implement

- 1 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 2 school year.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
