A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an accommodation process authorizing the use of state
3	highway rights-of-way by broadband-only providers.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 250, Transportation Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 250.002 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 250.002. RIGHT-OF-WAY ACCOMMODATION FOR
8	BROADBAND-ONLY PROVIDERS. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Broadband-only provider" means an entity that
10	exclusively provides broadband service.
11	(2) "Broadband service" means Internet service with
12	the capability of providing:
13	(A) a download speed of 25 megabits per second or
14	<pre>faster; and</pre>
15	(B) an upload speed of three megabits per second
16	or faster.
17	(b) The commission by rule shall:
18	(1) on a competitively and technologically neutral and
19	nondiscriminatory basis with respect to other providers of
20	broadband service, establish an accommodation process that
21	authorizes broadband-only providers to use state highway
22	rights-of-way, subject to highway purposes, for:
23	(A) new broadband facility installations;

- 1 (B) additions to or maintenance of existing 2 broadband facility installations;
- 3 (C) adjustments or relocations of broadband
- 4 facilities; and
- 5 (D) existing broadband facilities retained
- 6 within the rights-of-way; and
- 7 (2) prescribe minimum requirements for the
- 8 accommodation, method, materials, and location for the
- 9 installation, adjustment, and maintenance of broadband facilities
- 10 under the accommodation process.
- 11 SECTION 2. Not later than the first anniversary of the
- 12 effective date of this Act, the Texas Transportation Commission
- 13 shall adopt the rules required by Section 250.002, Transportation
- 14 Code, as added by this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
