- 2 relating to notice of and standing to protest certain alcoholic
- 3 beverage permit and license applications.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 11.393(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person who
- 8 submits an original application for a private club registration
- 9 permit or a permit authorizing the retail sale of alcoholic
- 10 beverages for on-premises consumption shall give written notice of
- 11 the application to each residential address and established
- 12 neighborhood association located within 1,000 [300] feet of any
- 13 property line of the premises for which the permit is sought.
- SECTION 2. (a) Section 11.431(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code,
- 15 as effective until September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) A member of the public may protest an application for:
- 17 (1) an original mixed beverage permit, private club
- 18 registration permit, or wine and beer retailer's permit if a
- 19 sexually oriented business is to be operated on the premises to be
- 20 covered by the permit;
- 21 (2) any renewal of a mixed beverage permit, private
- 22 club registration permit, or wine and beer retailer's permit if a
- 23 sexually oriented business is to be operated on the premises to be
- 24 covered by the permit and a petition is presented to the commission

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- 1 requesting a hearing which is signed by 50 percent of the residents
- 2 who reside within 1,000 [300] feet of any property line of the
- 3 affected premises;
- 4 (3) a private club registration permit or a permit
- 5 authorizing the retail sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises
- 6 consumption if the person resides within 1,000 [300] feet of any
- 7 property line of the premises for which the permit is sought; and
- 8 (4) a mixed beverage permit or a wine and beer
 - retailer's permit in a municipality with a population of 1,500,000
- 10 or more if:

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- 11 (A) any point of the property line of the premise
- 12 is less than 1,000 [300] feet from the nearest point on a property
- 13 line of a residence, church, school, hospital, day-care facility,
- 14 or social service facility, as measured in a straight line; and
- 15 (B) 75 percent or more of the permittee's actual
- 16 or anticipated gross revenue is from the sale of alcoholic
- 17 beverages.
- 18 (b) Section 11.431(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, as
- 19 effective September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) A member of the public may protest an application for:
- 21 (1) an original mixed beverage permit, private club
- 22 registration permit, or wine and malt beverage retailer's permit if
- 23 a sexually oriented business is to be operated on the premises to be
- 24 covered by the permit;
- 25 (2) any renewal of a mixed beverage permit, private
- 26 club registration permit, or wine and malt beverage retailer's
- 27 permit if a sexually oriented business is to be operated on the

- 1 premises to be covered by the permit and a petition is presented to
- 2 the commission requesting a hearing which is signed by 50 percent of
- 3 the residents who reside within 1,000 [300] feet of any property
- 4 line of the affected premises;
- 5 (3) a private club registration permit or a permit
- 6 authorizing the retail sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises
- 7 consumption if the person resides within $\frac{1,000}{1,000}$ [300] feet of any
- 8 property line of the premises for which the permit is sought; and
- 9 (4) a mixed beverage permit or a wine and malt beverage
- 10 retailer's permit in a municipality with a population of 1,500,000
- 11 or more if:
- 12 (A) any point of the property line of the premise
- 13 is less than 1,000 [300] feet from the nearest point on a property
- 14 line of a residence, church, school, hospital, day-care facility,
- 15 or social service facility, as measured in a straight line; and
- 16 (B) 75 percent or more of the permittee's actual
- 17 or anticipated gross revenue is from the sale of alcoholic
- 18 beverages.
- 19 SECTION 3. (a) Section 11.52(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code,
- 20 as effective until September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) In a municipality with a population of 1,500,000 or
- 22 more, an applicant for an original or renewal mixed beverage permit
- 23 or wine and beer retailer's permit shall provide the notice
- 24 required by Subsection (b) if:
- 25 (1) any point of the property line of the premise is
- less than 1,000 [300] feet from the nearest point on a property line
- 27 of a residence, church, school, hospital, day-care facility, or

- 1 social service facility, as measured in a straight line; and
- 2 (2) 75 percent or more of the permittee's actual or
- 3 anticipated gross revenue is from the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- 4 (b) Section 11.52(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, as effective
- 5 September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) In a municipality with a population of 1,500,000 or
- 7 more, an applicant for an original or renewal mixed beverage permit
- 8 or wine and malt beverage retailer's permit shall provide the
- 9 notice required by Subsection (b) if:
- 10 (1) any point of the property line of the premise is
- 11 less than 1,000 [300] feet from the nearest point on a property line
- 12 of a residence, church, school, hospital, day-care facility, or
- 13 social service facility, as measured in a straight line; and
- 14 (2) 75 percent or more of the permittee's actual or
- 15 anticipated gross revenue is from the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- SECTION 4. Section 61.313(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) A member of the public may protest an application for:
- 19 (1) an original retail dealer's on-premise license if
- 20 a sexually oriented business is to be operated on the premises to be
- 21 covered by the license;
- 22 (2) any renewal of a retail dealer's on-premise
- 23 license if a sexually oriented business is to be operated on the
- 24 premises to be covered by the license and a petition is presented to
- 25 the commission that is signed by 50 percent of the residents who
- 26 reside within 1,000 [300] feet of any property line of the affected
- 27 premises; or

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- 1 (3) a license authorizing the retail sale of malt
- 2 beverages for on-premises consumption if the person resides within
- $3 \quad 1,000 \quad [300]$ feet of any property line of the premises for which the
- 4 license is sought.
- 5 SECTION 5. (a) Section 61.382(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code,
- 6 as effective until September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person who
- 8 submits an original application for a license authorizing the
- 9 retail sale of beer for on-premises consumption shall give written
- 10 notice of the application to each residential address and
- 11 established neighborhood association located within 1,000 [300]
- 12 feet of any property line of the premises for which the license is
- 13 sought.
- 14 (b) Section 61.382(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, as
- 15 effective September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person who
- 17 submits an original application for a license authorizing the
- 18 retail sale of malt beverages for on-premises consumption shall
- 19 give written notice of the application to each residential address
- 20 and established neighborhood association located within 1,000
- [300] feet of any property line of the premises for which the
- 22 license is sought.
- SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply to an
- 24 application for an alcoholic beverage permit or license filed on or
- 25 after the effective date of this Act or pending on the effective
- 26 date of this Act.
- 27 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
