A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to consent for the use or possession of personal 3 identifying information under the Identity Theft Enforcement and 4 Protection Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 521.051, Business & Commerce Code, is 7 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to 8 read as follows:

9 (a) A person may not obtain, possess, transfer, or use 10 personal identifying information of another person without the 11 other person's consent <u>or effective consent</u> and with intent to 12 obtain a good, a service, insurance, an extension of credit, or any 13 other thing of value in the other person's name.

14 <u>(a-1) For purposes of this section, "effective consent"</u> 15 <u>includes consent given by a person legally authorized to act on</u> 16 <u>behalf of the person from whom consent is required.</u> Consent is not 17 <u>effective if:</u>

18

(1) induced by force, threat, fraud, or coercion; or

19 (2) given by a person who by reason of youth, mental 20 illness, or intellectual disability is known by the actor to be 21 unable to make reasonable decisions.

22 SECTION 2. Section 521.051, Business & Commerce Code, as 23 amended by this Act, applies only to a violation that occurs on or 24 after the effective date of this Act. A violation occurs before the

1 effective date of this Act if any element of the violation occurs 2 before that date. A violation that occurs before the effective date 3 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the 4 violation occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for 5 that purpose.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
