- 17 (1) uses a motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, or
- 18 other means of conveyance to transport an individual with the

- 20 (A) conceal the individual from a peace officer
- 21 or special investigator; or
- 22 (B) flee from a person the actor knows is a peace
- 23 officer or special investigator attempting to lawfully arrest or
- 24 detain the actor; [or]

- 1 (2) encourages or induces a person to enter or remain
- 2 in this country in violation of federal law by concealing,
- 3 harboring, or shielding that person from detection; or
- 4 (3) assists, guides, or directs two or more
- 5 individuals to enter or remain on agricultural land without the
- 6 effective consent of the owner.
- 7 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the third
- 8 degree, except that the offense is:
- 9 (1) a felony of the second degree if:
- 10 (A) the actor commits the offense in a manner
- 11 that creates a substantial likelihood that the smuggled individual
- 12 will suffer serious bodily injury or death; [or]
- 13 (B) the smuggled individual is a child younger
- 14 than 18 years of age at the time of the offense;
- 15 (C) the offense was committed with the intent to
- 16 <u>obtain a pecuniary benefit;</u>
- 17 <u>(D) during the commission of the offense the</u>
- 18 actor, another party to the offense, or an individual assisted,
- 19 guided, or directed by the actor knowingly possessed a firearm; or
- 20 (E) the actor commits the offense under
- 21 Subsection (a)(1)(B); or
- 22 (2) a felony of the first degree if:
- 23 (A) it is shown on the trial of the offense that,
- 24 as a direct result of the commission of the offense, the smuggled
- 25 individual became a victim of sexual assault, as defined by Section
- 26 22.011, or aggravated sexual assault, as defined by Section 22.021;

- 1 (B) the smuggled individual suffered serious
- 2 bodily injury or death.
- 3 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 8 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 9 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 10 before that date.
