1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of the Val Verde County Groundwater
3	Conservation District; providing authority to issue bonds;
4	providing authority to impose fees, surcharges, and taxes.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle H, Title 6, Special District Local Laws
7	Code, is amended by adding Chapter 8872 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 8872. VAL VERDE COUNTY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 8872.0101. DEFINITIONS. (a) Except as provided by
11	Subsection (b), the definitions in Section 36.001, Water Code,
12	apply to this chapter.
13	(b) In this chapter:
14	(1) "Aquifer" means that part of the Edwards-Trinity
15	(Plateau) Aquifer located in Val Verde County.
16	(2) "Board" means the board of directors of the
17	district.
18	(3) "City" means the City of Del Rio.
19	(4) "City council" means the city council of the city.
20	(5) "Commissioners court" means the Val Verde County
21	Commissioners Court.
22	(6) "County" means Val Verde County.
23	(7) "Development board" means the Texas Water
24	Development Board.

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S.B. No. 656 1 (8) "Director" means a member of the board. 2 (9) "District" means the Val Verde County Groundwater 3 Conservation District. 4 (10) "Domestic use" means the use of groundwater in 5 the district by a member of a well owner's household or by household employees, tenants, licensees, or guests for the following 6 7 purposes: 8 (A) drinking, washing, or culinary activities; 9 (B) irrigation of: (i) lawns; 10 (ii) family gardens; or 11 12 (iii) orchards, if the produce of the orchard is used only for household consumption; 13 14 (C) filling or maintaining swimming pools, 15 decorative ponds, or fountains located on the well owner's 16 property; and 17 (D) drinking water for domestic animals not raised, maintained, or sold for commercial purposes. 18 19 (11) "Existing well" means a well that is completed to produce groundwater in Val Verde County on or before January 1, 20 2021. The term includes a well that is reworked or repaired after 21 January 1, 2021, to restore the well's historic production 22 capacity, provided that the reworking or repair does not enlarge 23 24 the diameter of the well bore as the well bore existed on January 1, 25 2021. 26 (12) "Historic use" means the production and beneficial use of groundwater from an existing well in any calendar 27

1	year before January 1, 2021.
2	(13) "Political subdivision" means a governmental
3	entity of this state, including a county, municipality, state
4	agency, or district or authority created under Section 52, Article
5	III, or Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution. The term also
6	includes a nonprofit water supply corporation created under Chapter
7	<u>67, Water Code.</u>
8	Sec. 8872.0102. NATURE OF DISTRICT; PURPOSE. (a) The
9	district is a groundwater conservation district in Val Verde County
10	created under and essential to accomplish the purposes of Section
11	59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, including:
12	(1) the permitting, recharge, conservation,
13	protection, and prevention of the waste of groundwater in Val Verde
14	<u>County;</u>
15	(2) the control of subsidence caused by the
16	unreasonable withdrawal of groundwater;
17	(3) the regulation of transporting groundwater
18	outside the boundaries of the district;
19	(4) the regulation of groundwater production and the
20	implementation of drought management and conservation plans for the
21	reduction of drawdown when conditions warrant action to protect
22	spring flow and base flow;
23	(5) the maintenance of sufficient river flows during
24	periods of drought and water shortage to protect endangered species
25	and the habitats of endangered species;
26	(6) the development, with the assistance of the
27	development board, the Parks and Wildlife Department, and the Texas

1	Commission on Environmental Quality, of empirical groundwater flow
2	models to inform the district's groundwater management; and
3	(7) the management of the issuance of permits by
4	requiring studies and groundwater availability model analyses of
5	permit applications that include the use of conservation triggers
6	to mitigate the impact on spring flow, base flow, and drawdown.
7	(b) The district is created to serve a public use and
8	benefit.
9	(c) All of the land and other property included within the
10	boundaries of the district will benefit from the works and projects
11	that are to be accomplished by the district under powers conferred
12	by Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, this chapter, and
13	Chapter 36, Water Code.
14	Sec. 8872.0103. CONFIRMATION ELECTION REQUIRED. If the
15	creation of the district is not confirmed at a confirmation
16	election held under Section 8872.0153 before September 1, 2026:
17	(1) the district is dissolved September 1, 2026,
18	except that:
19	(A) any debts incurred shall be paid;
20	(B) any assets that remain after the payment of
21	debts shall be transferred to the county and the city in proportion
22	to the amount each entity has contributed to the costs of the
23	confirmation election and district operations; and
24	(C) the organization of the district shall be
25	maintained until all debts are paid and remaining assets are
26	transferred; and
27	(2) this chapter expires September 1, 2028.

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1	Sec. 8872.0104. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. The boundaries
2	of the district are coextensive with the boundaries of the county.
3	SUBCHAPTER A-1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONS
4	Sec. 8872.0151. APPOINTMENT OF TEMPORARY DIRECTORS;
5	VACANCIES; TERMS. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
6	date of the Act enacting this chapter, nine temporary directors
7	shall be appointed as follows:
8	(1) three temporary directors shall be appointed by
9	the commissioners court;
10	(2) three temporary directors shall be appointed by
11	the city council; and
12	(3) three temporary directors shall be appointed
13	jointly by the commissioners court, the city council, and the mayor
14	of the city.
15	(b) An individual appointed to serve as a temporary director
16	must be at least 18 years of age and be:
17	(1) a registered voter of the county; or
18	(2) an owner of taxable property in the county.
19	(c) If there is a vacancy on the temporary board of
20	directors of the district, the remaining temporary directors shall
21	appoint a person to fill the vacancy in a manner that meets the
22	representational requirements of this section.
23	(d) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:
24	(1) the date the temporary directors become initial
25	directors under Section 8872.0155; or
26	(2) the date this chapter expires under Section
27	8872.0103.

(e) Before the confirmation election under Section 1 2 8872.0153, the presiding officer of the district or the presiding 3 officer's designee may represent the district in the joint planning process under Section 36.108, Water Code, and shall be considered a 4 5 voting district representative. 6 Sec. 8872.0152. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF TEMPORARY 7 DIRECTORS. (a) As soon as practicable after all the temporary directors have qualified under Section 36.055, Water Code, a 8 majority of the temporary directors shall convene 9 the organizational meeting of the district at a location within the 10 district agreeable to a majority of the directors. If an agreement 11 12 on location cannot be reached, the organizational meeting shall be at the Val Verde County Courthouse. 13 14 (b) At the organizational meeting described by Subsection 15 (a), the temporary directors shall: 16 (1) elect a president as presiding officer, vice 17 president, secretary, and treasurer; 18 (2) schedule the confirmation election described by 19 Section 8872.0153; and (3) notify the applicable groundwater management area 20 of the district's creation, subject to confirmation under Section 21 22 8872.0153. Sec. 8872.0153. CONFIRMATION ELECTION. (a) The temporary 23 24 board shall order an election to be held on the uniform election date in November following January 1, 2022, to confirm the creation 25 26 of the district and authorize the collection of taxes. (b) The ballot for the election must be printed to permit 27

1 voting for or against the following proposition: "The creation of 2 the Val Verde County Groundwater Conservation District and the 3 imposition of an ad valorem tax in the district at a rate not to exceed three cents for each \$100 of assessed valuation." 4 5 (c) Except as provided by this section, a confirmation election must be conducted as provided by Sections 36.017(b)-(i), 6 7 Water Code, and the Election Code. 8 (d) If the district's creation is not confirmed at an election held under this section, the temporary directors may order 9 10 one or more subsequent elections to be held to confirm the creation of the district not earlier than the first anniversary of the 11 12 preceding confirmation election. If the district's creation is not confirmed at an election held under this section before September 13 1, 2026, the district is dissolved in accordance with Section 14 15 8872.0103. (e) The costs of an election held under this section shall 16 be paid equally by the county and the city. 17 Sec. 8872.0154. LIMITED POWERS OF 18 DISTRICT BEFORE 19 CONFIRMATION. (a) Before confirmation of the district, the district's powers are limited to: 20 (1) performance of the duties necessary to hold an 21 22 election to confirm the creation of the district; (2) registration of existing wells that are not exempt 23 24 from the district requirement to obtain a permit under this chapter or Chapter 36, Water Code; 25 26 (3) collection of annual groundwater production 27 reports from wells that are not exempt from the district

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1	requirement to obtain a permit under this chapter or Chapter 36,
2	Water Code; and
3	(4) participation in joint planning under Section
4	<u>36.108, Water Code.</u>
5	(b) The district shall adopt rules and prescribe forms
6	necessary to implement Subsections (a)(2) and (3).
7	Sec. 8872.0155. INITIAL DIRECTORS. (a) If the creation of
8	the district is confirmed at an election held under Section
9	8872.0153, the temporary directors become the initial directors and
10	serve until successor directors are appointed under Section
11	8872.0202.
12	(b) The initial directors shall provide notice to the
13	members of the groundwater management area in which the district is
14	located that the creation of the district is confirmed.
15	Sec. 8872.0156. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
16	expires September 1, 2028.
17	SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
18	Sec. 8872.0201. COMPOSITION OF BOARD. The district is
19	governed by a board of nine directors.
20	Sec. 8872.0202. TERMS; APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS;
21	VACANCIES; QUALIFICATIONS. (a) Directors serve staggered
22	four-year terms, with five or four terms expiring December 1 every
23	other year. The directors must be appointed as follows:
24	(1) one director appointed by the commissioners court
25	to represent each of the three management zones established by
26	Section 8872.0311;
27	(2) one director appointed jointly by the city council

1	and mayor of the city to represent each of the three management
2	zones established by Section 8872.0311; and
3	(3) one director appointed jointly by the
4	commissioners court, the city council, and the mayor of the city to
5	represent each of the three management zones established by Section
6	8872.0311.
7	(b) An individual appointed to serve as a director must be a
8	registered voter of the county.
9	(c) An individual appointed to serve as a director
10	representing a management zone must own taxable property in the
11	management zone.
12	(d) A director may serve consecutive terms.
13	Sec. 8872.0203. VACANCIES. (a) If there is a vacancy on
14	the board, a majority of the board shall appoint an individual to
15	fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the vacant
16	director place. The individual appointed to fill the vacancy must
17	meet the qualifications under Section 8872.0202 for the vacant
18	place.
19	(b) If the board has not filled a vacancy before the 90th day
20	after the date of the vacancy, the county judge of the county and
21	the mayor of the city jointly shall appoint an individual who meets
22	the qualifications under Section 8872.0202 for the vacant place to
23	serve as director for the remainder of the term being filled.
24	Sec. 8872.0204. COMPENSATION. (a) A director is not
25	entitled to receive compensation for performing the duties of a
26	director.
27	(b) The board may authorize a director to receive

1 reimbursement for the director's reasonable and actual expenses 2 incurred while engaging in activities inside or outside the 3 district on behalf of the board. 4 Sec. 8872.0205. BOARD OFFICERS. (a) At the first meeting 5 of the board in each calendar year, the board shall elect directors to serve as the president, vice president, secretary, and 6 7 treasurer. 8 (b) The president shall serve as the presiding officer of the board. 9 10 (c) The treasurer shall serve as the financial officer of the district. 11 12 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES Sec. 8872.0301. GENERAL POWERS. Except as otherwise 13 provided by this chapter, the district has all of the rights, 14 powers, privileges, functions, and duties provided by the general 15 law of this state applicable to groundwater conservation districts 16 17 created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, including Chapter 36, Water Code. 18 19 Sec. 8872.0302. LIMITATION ON RULEMAKING POWER NOT 20 APPLICABLE. Section 36.121, Water Code, does not apply to the 21 district. 22 Sec. 8872.0303. PERMITS: RULES. (a) The district shall 23 adopt rules to: 24 (1) require a person to obtain a permit from the district to drill and produce groundwater from a well, including an 25 26 existing well, unless the well is exclusively for agricultural or 27 domestic use or otherwise exempt from permitting under this chapter

1 or Chapter 36, Water Code; 2 (2) regulate the terms of a transfer of groundwater 3 out of the district; 4 (3) regulate the spacing of wells drilled after 5 September 1, 2021, to prevent unreasonable adverse interference 6 with other wells; 7 (4) provide for the uniform and nondiscriminatory reduction or curtailment of the production of groundwater by all 8 permit holders in the district, if necessary, to protect spring 9 flow and base flow and reduce aquifer drawdown; 10 11 (5) limit groundwater production: 12 (A) by the spacing of wells; (B) by basing production on acreage or tract 13 14 size; or 15 (C) for a public water supplier, by basing production on the service area of the supplier; 16 17 (6) provide for permit provisions that allow the reduction or curtailment of the production of groundwater, if 18 19 necessary, to protect spring flow and base flow and reduce aquifer 20 drawdown; 21 (7) allow for the injection of a nontoxic tracer dye as part of a hyd<u>rological study; and</u> 22 (8) require the owner of a well that is not exempt from 23 24 the district requirement to obtain a permit under this chapter or Chapter 36, Water Code, to report to the district in January of each 25 26 year the annual production of groundwater from the well based on metered production. 27

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1 (b) The terms of a permit that authorizes the production of 2 groundwater for transfer out of the district for beneficial use must be consistent with applicable law, including Section 36.122, 3 Water Code, and may not be more restrictive than the terms of a 4 5 permit authorizing the production of groundwater for beneficial use inside the district. 6 7 (c) The district may establish permit conditions and 8 limitations as provided by Section 36.122, Water Code. 9 The district may not require a permit or a permit (d) 10 amendment for the maintenance or repair of a well that is not exempt 11 from permitting under this chapter or Chapter 36, Water Code, if the 12 maintenance or repair does not make the well capable of producing an amount of groundwater that is greater than the production amounts 13 14 provided by the well's permit. 15 Sec. 8872.0304. PERMITS: CITY. The district shall grant to the city permits in the city's name that authorize the city to pump 16 17 from all wells operated or controlled by the city a cumulative volume of groundwater of 18,400 acre-feet per year. 18 19 Sec. 8872.0305. PERMITS: RETAIL PUBLIC UTILITY. (a) In this section, "retail public utility" has the meaning assigned by 20 Section 13.002, Water Code. 21 The district shall grant a permit to a retail public 22 (b) utility in the district or to a political subdivision other than the 23 24 city that is providing water or sewer service on or before the effective date of the Act enacting this chapter. The permit must 25 26 authorize the production of a cumulative volume of groundwater from 27 the wells owned by the entity in an amount equal to the amount of

groundwater required to meet the entity's current and projected
 needs as determined under Section 13.250, Water Code.

3 (c) Unless the district has authorized otherwise in 4 writing, a permitted entity may not resell groundwater produced 5 under the permit to any person for use or resale outside the 6 entity's service area, including the area covered by a certificate 7 of convenience and necessity, and must put the produced water to 8 beneficial use in the entity's service area.

9 <u>Sec. 8872.0306. PERMITS: COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL, AND</u>
 10 <u>TRANSPORT. (a) The district shall require a person to install a</u>
 11 <u>meter and obtain a permit from the district for commercial use,</u>
 12 <u>industrial use, or transport outside the district.</u>

13 (b) The district shall grant a permit for commercial use 14 that authorizes a person to drill one or more wells not to exceed 12 15 inches in diameter on land owned or controlled by the person through 16 a lease or other legal right.

17 (c) The district shall grant a permit for the production of groundwater from an existing well that is beneficially used for 18 19 commercial or industrial purposes outside the limits or the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the city. The permit must 20 authorize the production of a cumulative volume of groundwater that 21 22 is equal to the maximum historic use as proven by the person seeking 23 the permit. 24 Sec. 8872.0307. PERMIT RENEWAL. (a) Except as provided by 25 Subsection (b), the district without a hearing shall renew or

26 approve an application to renew an operating permit before the date

27 on which the permit expires, provided that:

(1) the application, if required by the district, is 1 2 submitted in a timely manner and accompanied by any required fees in 3 accordance with district rules; and 4 (2) the permit holder is not requesting a change 5 related to the renewal that would require a permit amendment under 6 district rules. 7 (b) The district is not required to renew a permit under 8 this section if the applicant: (1) is delinquent in paying a fee required by the 9 10 district; (2) is subject to a pending enforcement action for a 11 12 substantive violation of a district permit, order, or rule that has not been settled by agreement with the district or a final 13 14 adjudication; or 15 (3) has not paid a civil penalty or has otherwise failed to comply with an order resulting from a final adjudication 16 17 of a violation of a district permit, order, or rule. (c) If the district is not required to renew a permit under 18 Subsection (b)(2), the permit remains in effect until the final 19 settlement or adjudication on the matter of the substantive 20 violation. 21 Sec. 8872.0308. AGRICULTURAL AND DOMESTIC USE. (a) The 22 district may not require a person to install a meter or obtain a 23 24 permit from the district for a well that produces groundwater only for domestic or agricultural use in the district's territory. 25 26 (b) The district may not restrict the production of a well that produces groundwater only for domestic or agricultural use. 27

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1	(c) An owner of a well that produces groundwater for
2	domestic or agricultural use shall register the well with the
3	<u>district.</u>
4	(d) Subsection (a) does not affect the applicability in the
5	district of Section 36.113(a), Water Code.
6	Sec. 8872.0309. WELL REGISTRATION. A permit issued under
7	this chapter authorizing the production of groundwater from the
8	aquifer must also authorize the drilling and operation of a well or
9	wells in the aquifer, and must require the permit holder to:
10	(1) register each well with the district at no cost;
11	and
12	(2) file a copy of the well driller's log with the
13	district on completion of each well.
14	Sec. 8872.0310. PROPERTY RIGHTS. (a) A permit issued by
15	the district for the drilling, operation, or production of a well is
16	appurtenant to the real property on which the well is located.
17	Ownership of the groundwater, or the right to use and produce the
18	groundwater authorized by the permit, may be sold, leased,
19	assigned, or otherwise transferred by the owner, provided that the
20	rights granted by the permit to drill a well and to produce
21	groundwater are exercised on the real property described in the
22	permit based on the actual production authorized by the permit.
23	(b) Except as provided by this chapter, groundwater
24	produced as authorized by a permit, once captured at the wellhead,
25	may be beneficially used for any lawful purpose at any location,
26	whether on or off the real property to which the permit is attached,
27	provided that any beneficial use outside the boundaries of the

district is authorized by a transport permit issued by the 1 district. 2 3 Sec. 8872.0311. MANAGEMENT ZONES. (a) For the purpose of better managing groundwater resources, the district is divided into 4 5 three management zones as follows: 6 (1) the San Felipe Springs Management Zone, composed 7 of the territory described by Section 2(a) of the Act enacting this 8 chapter; 9 (2) the Devils River Management Zone, composed of the territory described by Section 2(b) of the Act enacting this 10 chapter; and 11 12 (3) the Pecos River Management Zone, composed of the territory described by Section 2(c) of the Act enacting this 13 14 chapter. (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of 15 the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the 16 17 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process does not affect the management zone's: 18 19 (1) organization, existence, or validity; or (2) legality or operation. 20 21 (c) The district may adopt different rules to regulate 22 production from the management zones based on the acreage, tract size, or service area of the public water supplier. 23 (d) The district must regulate the production 24 of groundwater in a management zone on a proportional, uniform, and 25 26 nondiscriminatory basis, except as provided by Section 8872.0303(a)(6). 27

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Sec. 8872.0312. REGIONAL GROUNDWATER PLANNING 1 AND 2 SUSTAINABILITY. (a) The district shall obtain or develop groundwater models for use in planning and management of the 3 aquifer and to assist the district in the district's role as a 4 5 member of the groundwater management area in which the district is 6 located. 7 (b) The district, to the extent possible, shall diligently pursue the long-term health and sustainability of the aquifer 8 through joint planning under Section 36.108, Water Code. 9 10 Sec. 8872.0313. REDUCTION AND CURTAILMENT. (a) The board by rule may provide for the reduction and curtailment of the 11 12 production of groundwater from a well permitted under this chapter to protect spring flow and base flow and reduce drawdown in 13 14 accordance with Sections 8872.0303(a)(4) and (5). 15 (b) To implement a reduction or curtailment, the district may, to the extent not otherwise authorized by Section 36.101(a), 16 17 Water Code, limit groundwater production as provided by district 18 rules. (c) Rules adopted by the board under Sections 19 8872.0303(a)(4) and (5) requiring a reduction or curtailment of the 20 production of groundwater must be applied on a proportional, 21 uniform, and nondiscriminatory basis to all permitted production, 22 unless the condition requiring reduction or curtailment is limited 23 24 to a management zone created under Section 8872.0311. 25 (d) This section does not apply to a permit provision 26 imposed under Section 8872.0303(a)(6). Sec. 8872.0314. RIGHT TO ENTER LAND. Section 36.123, Water 27

1 Code, which authorizes a district's employees or agents to go on and 2 inspect the property of a landowner, applies to the district 3 provided that: 4 (1) access is subject to written notice to the 5 landowner; and 6 (2) the district's employees and agents are prohibited 7 from carrying firearms on the landowner's property. 8 Sec. 8872.0315. WATER CONSERVATION INITIATIVE. The district may create a water conservation initiative as provided by 9 10 Section 11.32, Tax Code. Sec. 8872.0316. PROHIBITION ON DISTRICT PURCHASE, SALE, 11 12 TRANSPORT, OR DISTRIBUTION OF WATER. The district may not purchase, sell, transport, or distribute surface water or 13 groundwater for any purpose. 14 15 Sec. 8872.0317. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may 16 not exercise the power of eminent domain. 17 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS Sec. 8872.0401. LIMITATION ON TAXES. The district may not 18 19 impose ad valorem taxes at a rate that exceeds three cents on each 20 \$100 valuation of taxable property in the district. Sec. 8872.0402. APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN TAX PROVISIONS. 21 (a) Sections 26.04, 26.05, 26.06, and 26.07, Tax Code, do not apply 22 to a tax imposed by the district. 23 24 (b) Section 49.236, Water Code, applies to the district. Sec. 8872.0403. FEES. (a) The board by rule may impose 25 26 uniform, reasonable, equitable, and nondiscriminatory annual production fees on the amount of permitted water actually produced 27

1 from each well.

2 (b) A production fee must be consistent with Section 36.205,
3 Water Code, and may be based on:

4 (1) the size of column pipe used by the well; or

5 (2) the amount of water actually withdrawn from the 6 well, or the amount authorized or anticipated to be withdrawn.

7 (c) The district may assess a uniform and nondiscriminatory 8 export fee consistent with Section 36.122, Water Code, on 9 groundwater that is produced from a well inside the district and 10 transferred outside the district.

11 (d) The district by rule or resolution may set fees relating 12 to administrative acts of the district, including filing 13 applications, reviewing and processing permits, conducting permit 14 hearings, providing public notice, and paying costs of legal fees, 15 expert fees, and hearing facility rental fees. The district may not 16 assess a fee in an amount greater than \$250 for processing permits.

SECTION 2. (a) The San Felipe Springs Management Zoneincludes all the territory contained in the following area:

BEGINNING: At the point at which U.S. Highway 77 intersects
with the Eastern boundary of Val Verde County;

21 THENCE: Along the Southeasterly right-of-way line of U.S.22 Route 77 to the junction of U.S. Route 90 and U.S. Route 377;

THENCE: Along the Easterly right-of-way line of U.S. Route 90 to the junction of U.S. Route 90 and Texas Highway 349, to the Southwestern boundary of Val Verde County;

THENCE: Eastward along the border of Val Verde County, and in a Northward direction along the border of Val Verde County to the

1 POINT OF BEGINNING.

2 (b) The Devils River Management Zone includes all the3 territory contained in the following area:

BEGINNING: At the point at which U.S. Highway 77 intersects
with the Eastern boundary of Val Verde County;

THENCE: Along the Southeasterly right-of-way line of U.S.
Route 77 to the junction of U.S. Route 90 and U.S. Route 377;

8 THENCE: Along the Northerly right-of-way of U.S. Route 90 to 9 the junction of U.S. Route 90 and Texas Ranch to Market Road 1024;

10 THENCE: Along the Northerly right-of-way of Texas Ranch to 11 Market Road 1024 to the point that Texas Ranch to Market Road 1024 12 bears in a Westerly direction at an approximate latitude of 13 30.188886 and an approximate longitude of -101.331504;

14 THENCE: Northwesterly to the Northern boundary of Val Verde 15 County;

16 THENCE: Easterly along the boundary of Val Verde County and 17 Southerly along the boundary of Val Verde County to the POINT OF 18 BEGINNING.

19 (c) The Pecos River Management Zone includes all the20 territory contained in the following area:

BEGINNING: At the point Texas Highway 349 intersects with the
 Southeastern boundary of Val Verde County;

THENCE: Northwesterly along the boundary of Val Verde County; continuing along the county's border until the Western boundary of the Devil's River Management Zone;

26 THENCE: Southerly along the Western Boundary of the Devil's 27 River Management Zone to the POINT OF BEGINNING.

1 SECTION 3. At the first meeting of the board of directors of the Val Verde County Groundwater Conservation District that follows 2 3 the election held under Section 8872.0153, Special District Local Laws Code, as added by this Act, the directors shall draw lots to 4 5 determine which three directors serve a term expiring December 1 of the year two years after the date of the election and which two 6 directors serve a term expiring December 1 of the year four years 7 8 after the date of the election.

9 SECTION 4. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 10 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 11 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 12 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 13 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 14 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 15 Government Code.

16 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has 17 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 18 Environmental Quality.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 19 (c) its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 20 governor, and the speaker 21 lieutenant of the house of representatives within the required time. 22

(d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
and accomplished.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
