4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code is
6	amended by adding new Section 552.161 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 552.161. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN
8	GOVERNMENT OPERATED UTILITY CUSTOMER INFORMATION. (a) In this
9	section:
10	(1) "Advanced metering system" means any metering
11	system that collects periodic data at regular intervals through the
12	use of an automated wireless or radio network.
13	(2) "Government-operated utility" has the meaning

- assigned by Section 182.051(3), Utilities Code. 14
- (b) Information is excepted from the requirements of 15
- Section 552.021, Government Code, if it is information maintained 16
- by a government-operated utility that: 17
- 18 (1) discloses whether services have been discontinued
- or are eligible for disconnection by the government-operated 19
- 20 utility; or
- (2) is collected as part of an advanced metering 21
- 22 system for usage, services, and billing, including, amounts billed
- or collected for utility usage, except that all such information is 23
- to be made available to that customer or their designated 24

- 1 representative.
- 2 (c) The exception to public disclosure created by this
- 3 section is in addition to any exception created by Section 552.101,
- 4 Government Code, including information made confidential by law
- 5 pursuant to Section 182.052, Utilities Code. Public access to
- 6 customer billing information covered by 552.101, Government Code,
- 7 is denied to the extent provided by that section.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 182.052(a), (b), (c), and (d), Utilities
- 9 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) Except as provided by Section 182.054, a
- 11 government-operated utility may not disclose personal information
- 12 in a customer's account record, or any information relating to the
- 13 volume or units of utility usage or the amounts billed to or
- 14 collected from the individual for utility usage, unless $\frac{if}{i}$ the
- 15 customer requests that the government-operated utility <u>disclose</u>
- 16 such information keep the information confidential. However, a
- 17 government-operated utility may disclose information related to
- 18 the customer's volume or units of utility usage per billing cycle or
- 19 amounts billed to or collected from the individual for utility
- 20 usage if the primary source of water for such utility was a
- 21 sole-source designated aquifer.
- 22 (b) A customer may request <u>disclosure of the information</u>
- 23 <u>under Subsection (a)</u> confidentiality by delivering to the
- 24 government-operated utility an appropriately marked form provided
- 25 under Subsection (c)(3) or any other written request for <u>disclosure</u>
- 26 confidentiality.
- 27 (c) A government-operated utility shall include with a bill

- 1 sent to each customer or on its website:
- 2 (1) a notice of the customer's right to request
- 3 disclosure confidentiality under this subchapter; and
- 4 (2) a statement of the amount of any fee applicable to
- 5 the request; and
- (3) (2) a form by which the customer may request
- 7 disclosure confidentiality by marking an appropriate box on the
- 8 form and returning it to the government-operated utility by mail or
- 9 electronically.
- 10 (d) A customer may rescind a request for disclosure
- 11 confidentiality by providing the government-operated utility
- 12 written request to treat such permission to disclose personal
- 13 information as confidential from and after the date the
- 14 government-operated utility receives such written request.
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 182.053, Utilities Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1,2021.
