6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	ARTICLE 1. STATE ANATOMICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE; TEXAS FUNERAL
8	SERVICE COMMISSION
9	SECTION 1.01. The heading to Chapter 691, Health and Safety
10	Code, is amended to read as follows:
11	CHAPTER 691. DONATION OF BODIES AND ANATOMICAL SPECIMENS
12	[ANATOMICAL BOARD OF THE STATE OF TEXAS]
13	SECTION 1.02. The heading to Subchapter A, Chapter 691,
14	Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
15	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS; STATE [ORGANIZATION OF]
16	ANATOMICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE [BOARD OF THE STATE OF TEXAS]
17	SECTION 1.03. Section 691.001, Health and Safety Code, is
18	amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivisions (4) and
19	(5) to read as follows:
20	(1) "Advisory committee [Board]" means the State
21	Anatomical Advisory Committee [Board of the State of Texas].
22	(4) "Commission" means the Texas Funeral Service

Commission.

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(5) "Willed body program" means a program operated at

- 1 an institution of higher education in this state and approved by the
- 2 commission that allows a living individual to donate the
- 3 individual's body or anatomical specimen for educational or
- 4 research purposes.
- 5 SECTION 1.04. Section 691.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 691.002. <u>ADVISORY COMMITTEE</u> [COMPOSITION OF BOARD].
- 8 (a) The State Anatomical Advisory Committee is established to
- 9 advise the commission on matters related to the regulation and
- 10 operation of willed body programs in this state.
- 11 (b) The advisory committee is composed of representatives
- 12 appointed by the commission from institutions of higher education
- 13 that operate willed body programs [The Anatomical Board of the
- 14 State of Texas is composed of one representative from each school or
- 15 college of chiropractic, osteopathy, medicine, or dentistry
- 16 <u>incorporated in this state</u>].
- 17 (c) Members of the advisory committee serve two-year terms
- 18 [(b) On March 1 of each odd-numbered year, the chief executive
- 19 officer of each institution described by Subsection (a) shall
- 20 appoint as the institution's representative on the board one
- 21 professor of surgery or of basic anatomical sciences who is
- 22 associated with the institution].
- 23 (d) [<del>(c)</del>] Appointments to the <u>advisory committee</u> [<del>board</del>]
- 24 shall be made without regard to the race, creed, sex, religion, or
- 25 national origin of the appointees.
- 26 (e) Sections 2110.002 and 2110.008, Government Code, do not
- 27 apply to the advisory committee.

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- 1 SECTION 1.05. Section 691.007(c), Health and Safety Code,
- 2 is redesignated as Section 691.011, Health and Safety Code, and
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 691.011. RECORDS.  $[\frac{(c)}{c}]$  The commission  $[\frac{board}{c}]$  shall
- 5 keep identification records of each body donated to the commission
- 6 [board] and of each body or anatomical specimen distributed by the
- 7 commission [board].
- 8 SECTION 1.06. Section 691.008(a), Health and Safety Code,
- 9 is redesignated as Section 691.012, Health and Safety Code, and
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 <u>Sec. 691.012. FEES. [(a)</u>] The <u>commission [board</u>] may set
- 12 and collect reasonable and necessary fees for:
- 13 (1) receiving and distributing bodies and anatomical
- 14 specimens; and
- (2) conducting inspections of institutions or other
- 16 persons authorized to receive and use bodies or anatomical
- 17 specimens under this chapter.
- 18 SECTION 1.07. Section 691.010, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 Sec. 691.010. PUBLIC INFORMATION AND PARTICIPATION;
- 21 COMPLAINTS. (a) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall prepare information
- 22 of public interest describing the functions of the commission under
- 23 <u>this chapter</u> [board] and the <u>commission's</u> [board's] procedures by
- 24 which complaints are filed with and resolved by the commission
- 25 [board]. The commission [board] shall make the information
- 26 available to the public and appropriate state agencies.
- 27 (b) The commission [board] by rule shall establish methods

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- 1 by which service recipients can be notified of the name, mailing
- 2 address, and telephone number of the commission [board] for the
- 3 purpose of directing complaints to the commission [board]. The
- 4 commission [board] may provide for that notification by including
- 5 the information on each written contract relating to bodies willed
- 6 or donated to an entity regulated by the commission [board] or
- 7 authorized by the commission [board] to receive bodies.
- 8 (c) The commission [board] shall keep an information file
- 9 about each complaint filed with the commission [board] relating to
- 10 its functions <u>under this chapter</u>. If a written complaint is filed
- 11 with the commission [board] relating to a person or an entity
- 12 regulated by the commission under this chapter [board], the
- 13 commission [board, at least as frequently as quarterly and until
- 14 final disposition of the complaint, shall periodically notify the
- 15 parties to the complaint of the status of the complaint until final
- 16 <u>disposition</u> unless notice would jeopardize an undercover
- 17 investigation.
- 18 (d) The commission [board] shall develop and implement
- 19 policies that provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to
- 20 appear before the <a href="commission">commission</a> [board] and to speak on any issue under
- 21 the jurisdiction of the <a href="commission">commission</a> [board].
- 22 SECTION 1.08. Section 691.022, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 691.022. GENERAL DUTIES. (a) The commission [board]
- 25 shall distribute bodies and anatomical specimens to institutions of
- 26 higher education that operate willed body programs and other
- 27 institutions and persons authorized to receive a body or specimen

- 1 <u>under this chapter</u> [them].
- 2 (b) The commission [board] shall adopt rules to ensure that
- 3 each body and anatomical specimen is treated with respect while in
- 4 the custody of the commission [board] or an institution or person
- 5 authorized to receive the body or specimen, including an
- 6 institution of higher education that operates a willed body program
- 7 [represented on the board is treated with respect].
- 8 (c) The commission may not adopt a rule related to standards
- 9 of practice, ethics, qualifications, or disciplinary sanctions for
- 10 <u>institutions or persons regulated under this chapter unless the</u>
- 11 advisory committee first proposes the rule and the proposed rule is
- 12 <u>authorized by this chapter. The commission may not modify a rule</u>
- 13 described by this subsection that is proposed by the advisory
- 14 committee. If the commission declines to adopt a rule proposed by
- 15 the advisory committee, the commission shall return the rule to the
- 16 advisory committee with an explanation of the reasons the
- 17 <u>commission declined to adopt the rule.</u>
- 18 (d) The commission shall adopt rules, establish procedures,
- 19 and prescribe forms necessary to administer and enforce this
- 20 chapter.
- 21 SECTION 1.09. Section 691.0225, Health and Safety Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 691.0225. INFORMATIONAL DOCUMENT. The <u>commission</u>
- 24 [board] shall develop a document to inform a person making a gift of
- 25 a decedent's body or anatomical specimen for purposes of education,
- 26 including forensic science education, or research of the risks and
- 27 benefits associated with donation. The commission [board] shall

- 1 make the document available on the <a href="mailto:commission">commission</a>'s [board's] Internet
- 2 website.
- 3 SECTION 1.10. Section 691.023, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 691.023. DUTY TO DELIVER CERTAIN BODIES TO COMMISSION
- 6 [BOARD]. (a) An officer, employee, or representative of the state,
- 7 of a political subdivision, or of an institution having charge or
- 8 control of a body not claimed for burial or a body required to be
- 9 buried at public expense shall:
- 10 (1) notify the <u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u>
- 11 [board's] representative of the body's existence when the body
- 12 comes into the person's possession, charge, or control if notified
- 13 in writing to do so by the commission [board] or the commission's
- 14 [board's] representative;
- 15 (2) deliver the body in accordance with the direction
- 16 of the commission [board]; and
- 17 (3) allow the commission [board], the commission's
- 18 [board's] representative, or a physician designated by the
- 19 commission [board] who complies with this chapter to remove the
- 20 body to be used for the advancement of medical or forensic science.
- 21 (b) If the <u>commission</u> [board] does not require a political
- 22 subdivision or agency of the political subdivision to deliver a
- 23 body under this section, the political subdivision shall pay all
- 24 costs of preparation for burial, including costs of embalming.
- SECTION 1.11. Section 691.025(c), Health and Safety Code,
- 26 is amended to read as follows:
- 27 (c) A body that is not claimed for burial within 48 hours

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- 1 after a relative receives notification shall be delivered as soon
- 2 as possible to the commission [board] or the commission's [board's]
- 3 representative.
- 4 SECTION 1.12. Section 691.026, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 691.026. BODY OF TRAVELER. If an unclaimed body is the
- 7 body of a traveler who died suddenly, the commission [board] shall
- 8 direct the institution or other person receiving the body to retain
- 9 the body for six months for purposes of identification.
- SECTION 1.13. Section 691.027, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 691.027. AUTOPSY. Only the <u>commission</u> [board] may
- 13 grant permission to perform an autopsy on an unclaimed body. The
- 14 commission [board] may grant permission after receiving a specific
- 15 request for an autopsy that shows sufficient evidence of medical
- 16 urgency.
- SECTION 1.14. Section 691.028(a), Health and Safety Code,
- 18 is amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) An adult living in this state who is of sound mind may
- 20 donate the adult's body by will or other written instrument to the
- 21 <u>commission</u> [board], a medical or dental school, or another donee
- 22 authorized by the  $\underline{\text{commission}}$  [ $\underline{\text{board}_{r}}$ ] to be used for the
- 23 advancement of medical or forensic science.
- SECTION 1.15. Section 691.029, Health and Safety Code, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 691.029. AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT BODIES FROM OUTSIDE THE
- 27 STATE. The commission [board] may receive a body transported to the

- 1 <u>commission</u> [board] from outside this state.
- 2 SECTION 1.16. Section 691.030, Health and Safety Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 691.030. COMMISSION'S [BOARD'S] AUTHORITY TO
- 5 DISTRIBUTE BODIES AND ANATOMICAL SPECIMENS. (a) The commission
- 6 [board] or the commission's [board's] representative shall
- 7 distribute bodies donated to it and may redistribute bodies donated
- 8 to medical or dental schools or other donees authorized by the
- 9 commission [board] to:
- 10 (1) schools and colleges of chiropractic, osteopathy,
- 11 medicine, or dentistry incorporated in this state;
- 12 (2) forensic science programs;
- 13 (3) search and rescue organizations or recovery teams
- 14 that are recognized by the  $\underline{\text{commission}}$  [board], are exempt from
- 15 federal taxation under Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of
- 16 1986, and use human remains detection canines with the
- 17 authorization of a local or county law enforcement agency;
- 18 (4) physicians; and
- 19 (5) other persons as provided by this section.
- 20 (b) In making the distribution, the commission [board]
- 21 shall give priority to the schools and colleges that need bodies for
- 22 lectures and demonstrations.
- (c) If the commission [board] has remaining bodies, the
- 24 commission [board] or the commission's [board's] representative
- 25 shall distribute or redistribute those bodies to the schools and
- 26 colleges proportionately and equitably according to the number of
- 27 students in each school or college receiving instruction or

- 1 demonstration in normal or morbid anatomy and operative surgery.
- 2 The dean of each school or college shall certify that number to the
- 3 commission [board] when required by the commission [board].
- 4 (d) The commission [board] may transport a body or
- 5 anatomical specimen to an authorized recipient in another state if
- 6 the commission [board] determines that the supply of bodies or
- 7 anatomical specimens in this state exceeds the need for bodies or
- 8 anatomical specimens in this state and if:
- 9 (1) the deceased donated the deceased's [his] body in
- 10 compliance with Section 691.028 and at the time of the donation
- 11 authorized the commission [board] to transport the body outside
- 12 this state; or
- 13 (2) the body was donated in compliance with Chapter
- 14 692A and the person authorized to make the donation under Section
- 15 692A.009 authorized the <u>commission</u> [board] to transport the body
- 16 outside this state.
- 17 SECTION 1.17. Sections 691.031(a), (b), and (f), Health and
- 18 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) The commission [board] shall adopt rules to ensure that:
- 20 (1) each body or anatomical specimen received or
- 21 distributed by the commission [board] is properly transported;
- 22 (2) a label with the statement "CONTENTS DERIVED FROM
- 23 DONATED HUMAN TISSUE" is affixed to the container in which the body
- 24 or anatomical specimen is transported; and
- 25 (3) each person who has control or possession of a body
- 26 or anatomical specimen:
- 27 (A) satisfactorily completes the information

- 1 required on a chain-of-custody form prescribed by the <a href="commission">commission</a>
- 2 [board];
- 3 (B) maintains a copy of the form for the person's
- 4 records; and
- 5 (C) transfers the form to any other person to
- 6 whom control or possession of the body or anatomical specimen is
- 7 transferred.
- 8 (b) The commission [board] may employ a public carrier to
- 9 transport bodies or anatomical specimens received or distributed by
- 10 the commission [board].
- 11 (f) The sender and receiver of each body or anatomical
- 12 specimen shall file the records required under this section in
- 13 accordance with commission [board] rules so that the commission
- 14 [board] or a district or county attorney may inspect the records at
- 15 any time.
- SECTION 1.18. Section 691.032, Health and Safety Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 691.032. COSTS OF DISTRIBUTION. A person or
- 19 institution receiving a body or anatomical specimen under this
- 20 chapter shall pay in a manner specified by the <a href="commission">commission</a> [board],
- 21 or as otherwise agreed on, all costs incurred in distributing the
- 22 body or anatomical specimen so that the state, a county, a
- 23 municipality, or an officer, employee, or representative of the
- 24 state, a county, or a municipality does not incur any expense.
- 25 SECTION 1.19. Sections 691.033(a), (b), and (d), Health and
- 26 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) To further medical or forensic science, a school,

- 1 college, or person designated by the <a href="commission">commission</a> [board] may use,
- 2 dissect, operate on, examine, and experiment on a body or
- 3 anatomical specimen distributed under this chapter.
- 4 (b) A school, college, or person shall keep a permanent
- 5 record of each body or anatomical specimen received from the
- 6 <u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u> [board's] representative.
- 7 The record must be sufficient to identify the body or anatomical
- 8 specimen and may be inspected by the commission [board] or the
- 9 commission's [board's] representative.
- 10 (d) To aid prosecutions under Section 42.08, Penal Code, the
- 11 <a href="mailto:commission">commission</a> [board] shall adopt rules that clearly state the
- 12 activities that are authorized by the commission [board] in
- 13 relation to the use or dissection of a body.
- 14 SECTION 1.20. Section 691.034, Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 691.034. REGULATION OF PERSONS AND INSTITUTIONS USING
- 17 BODIES AND ANATOMICAL SPECIMENS. (a) The commission [board] shall
- 18 inspect and may approve institutions and other persons for the
- 19 receipt and use of bodies and anatomical specimens under this
- 20 chapter.
- 21 (b) The <u>commission</u> [board] may investigate a person or
- 22 institution if the commission [board] has reason to believe that
- 23 the person or institution has improperly used a body or anatomical
- 24 specimen.
- 25 (c) The commission [board] may suspend or revoke a person's
- 26 or institution's authorization to receive and use or dissect bodies
- 27 or anatomical specimens if the commission [board] determines that

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- 1 the person or institution has improperly used a body or anatomical
- 2 specimen.
- 3 (d) A person or institution is entitled to a hearing before
- 4 the commission [board] or a hearing examiner appointed by the
- 5 commission [board] before the commission [board] may revoke the
- 6 person's or institution's authorization to receive and use or
- 7 dissect bodies or anatomical specimens. The commission [board]
- 8 shall make all final decisions to suspend or revoke an
- 9 authorization.
- SECTION 1.21. Subchapter A, Chapter 651, Occupations Code,
- 11 is amended by adding Section 651.005 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 651.005. REGULATION OF WILLED BODY PROGRAMS. The
- 13 commission shall regulate willed body programs as provided by
- 14 Chapter 691, Health and Safety Code, and in accordance with the
- 15 powers and duties granted by this chapter to the extent necessary to
- 16 regulate the programs under that chapter.
- 17 SECTION 1.22. The following provisions of the Health and
- 18 Safety Code are repealed:
- 19 (1) Section 691.003;
- 20 (2) Section 691.004;
- 21 (3) Section 691.005;
- 22 (4) Section 691.006;
- 23 (5) Sections 691.007(a), (b), and (d);
- 24 (6) Sections 691.008(b) and (d);

ARTICLE 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENTS

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2 SECTION 2.01. Article 43.25, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 Art. 43.25. BODY OF CONVICT. The body of a convict who has 5 been legally executed shall be embalmed immediately and so directed by the Director of the correctional institutions division of the 6 Texas Department of Criminal Justice [Department of Corrections]. 7 8 If the body is not demanded or requested by a relative or bona fide friend within forty-eight hours after execution then it shall be 9 delivered to the Texas Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical Board 10 of the State of Texas], if requested by the <a href="commission">commission</a> [Board]. If 11 the body is requested by a relative,  $\underline{a}$  bona fide friend, or the 12 Texas Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical Board of the State of 13 14 Texas], such recipient shall pay a fee [of] not to exceed 15 twenty-five dollars to the mortician for the mortician's [his] services in embalming the body for which the mortician shall issue 16 17 to the recipient a written receipt. When such receipt is delivered to the Director of the correctional institutions division of the 18 19 Texas Department of Criminal Justice [Department of Corrections], the body of the deceased shall be delivered to the party named in 20 the receipt or  $\underline{\text{the party's}}$  [ $\underline{\text{his}}$ ] authorized agent. If the body is 21 not delivered to a relative, a bona fide friend, or the Texas 22 Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical Board of the State of 23 24 Texas], the Director of the correctional institutions division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice [<del>Department of</del> 25 26 Corrections] shall cause the body to be decently buried, and the fee for embalming shall be paid by the county in which the indictment 27

- 1 which resulted in conviction was found.
- 2 SECTION 2.02. Section 404.093(b), Government Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (b) This subchapter does not apply to:
- 5 (1) funds pledged to the payment of bonds, notes, or
- 6 other debts if the funds are not otherwise required to be deposited
- 7 in the treasury;
- 8 (2) funds held in trust or escrow for the benefit of a
- 9 person or entity other than a state agency;
- 10 (3) funds set apart out of earnings derived from
- 11 investment of funds held in trust for others, as administrative
- 12 expenses of the trustee agency; or
- 13 (4) funds, grants, donations, and proceeds from funds,
- 14 grants, and donations, given in trust to the Texas State Library and
- 15 Archives Commission for the establishment and maintenance of
- 16 regional historical resource depositories and libraries in
- 17 accordance with Section 441.154[ + or
- 18 [<del>(5) funds under the management of the</del>
- 19 secretary-treasurer of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas,
- 20 as provided by Section 691.008, Health and Safety Code].
- 21 SECTION 2.03. Sections 692A.011(a), (b), and (c), Health and
- 22 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) An anatomical gift may be made to the following persons
- 24 named in the document of gift:
- 25 (1) an organ procurement organization to be used for
- 26 transplantation, therapy, research, or education;
- 27 (2) a hospital to be used for research;

- 1 (3) subject to Subsection (d), an individual
- 2 designated by the person making the anatomical gift if the
- 3 individual is the recipient of the part;
- 4 (4) an eye bank or tissue bank, except that use of a
- 5 gift of a whole body must be coordinated through the Texas Funeral
- 6 Service Commission [Anatomical Board of the State of Texas];
- 7 (5) a forensic science program at:
- 8 (A) a general academic teaching institution as
- 9 defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; or
- 10 (B) a private or independent institution of
- 11 higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code;
- 12 (6) a search and rescue organization or recovery team
- 13 that is recognized by the <u>Texas Funeral Service Commission</u>
- 14 [Anatomical Board of the State of Texas], is exempt from federal
- 15 taxation under Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986,
- 16 and uses human remains detection canines with the authorization of
- 17 a local or county law enforcement agency; or
- 18 (7) the Texas Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical
- 19 Board of the State of Texas].
- 20 (b) Except for donations described by Subsections (a)(1)
- 21 through (6), the <u>Texas Funeral Service Commission</u> [Anatomical Board
- 22 of the State of Texas] shall be the donee of gifts of bodies or parts
- 23 of bodies made for the purpose of education or research that are
- 24 subject to distribution by the <u>commission</u> [board] under Chapter
- 25 691.
- 26 (c) A forensic science program that receives a donation
- 27 under Subsection (a)(5) must submit a report to the Texas Funeral

- 1 <u>Service Commission</u> [Anatomical Board of the State of Texas] on a
- 2 quarterly basis that lists:
- 3 (1) the number of bodies or parts of bodies that the
- 4 program received; and
- 5 (2) the method in which the program used the bodies or
- 6 parts of bodies for education or research.
- 7 ARTICLE 3. TRANSITIONS AND EFFECTIVE DATE
- 8 SECTION 3.01. (a) The Anatomical Board of the State of Texas
- 9 is abolished but continues in existence until September 1, 2022,
- 10 for the sole purpose of transferring obligations, property, rights,
- 11 powers, and duties to the Texas Funeral Service Commission. The
- 12 Texas Funeral Service Commission assumes all of the obligations,
- 13 property, rights, powers, and duties of the Anatomical Board of the
- 14 State of Texas as they exist immediately before the effective date
- 15 of this Act. All unexpended and unobligated funds under the
- 16 management of the secretary-treasurer of the Anatomical Board of
- 17 the State of Texas, as provided by Section 691.008, Health and
- 18 Safety Code, as that section existed immediately before the
- 19 effective date of this Act, are transferred to the general revenue
- 20 fund for the purpose of the Texas Funeral Service Commission
- 21 administering duties under Chapter 691, Health and Safety Code, as
- 22 amended by this Act.
- 23 (b) The Anatomical Board of the State of Texas and the Texas
- 24 Funeral Service Commission shall, in consultation with appropriate
- 25 state entities, ensure that the transfer of the obligations,
- 26 property, rights, powers, and duties of the Anatomical Board of the
- 27 State of Texas to the Texas Funeral Service Commission is completed

- 1 not later than September 1, 2022.
- 2 (c) All rules of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas 3 are continued in effect as rules of the Texas Funeral Service
- 4 Commission until superseded by a rule of the Texas Funeral Service
- 5 Commission. An authorization issued by the Anatomical Board of the
- 6 State of Texas is continued in effect as provided by the law in
- 7 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act. Ar
- 8 authorization pending on the effective date of this Act is
- 9 continued without change in status after the effective date of this
- 10 Act. A complaint, investigation, or other proceeding pending on the
- 11 effective date of this Act is continued without change in status
- 12 after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 (d) Unless the context indicates otherwise, a reference to
- 14 the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas in a law or

- SECTION 3.02. (a) Not later than the 60th day after the
- 17 effective date of this Act, the Texas Funeral Service Commission
- 18 shall appoint members to the State Anatomical Advisory Committee in
- 19 accordance with Section 691.002, Health and Safety Code, as amended
- 20 by this Act.
- 21 (b) The members of the Anatomical Board of the State of
- 22 Texas whose terms expire under Section 3.01 of this Act shall
- 23 continue to provide advice to the Texas Funeral Service Commission
- 24 until a majority of the members of the State Anatomical Advisory
- 25 Committee are appointed under Subsection (a) of this section and
- 26 qualified. A member of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas
- 27 described by this subsection may be appointed to the State

- 1 Anatomical Advisory Committee if the member is otherwise eligible
- 2 for appointment under Section 691.002, Health and Safety Code, as
- 3 amended by this Act.
- SECTION 3.03. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
