A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the continuation of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission as an advisory committee to the Texas Historical 3 Commission. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 449, Government Code, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 CHAPTER 449. TEXAS HOLOCAUST AND GENOCIDE ADVISORY COMMITTEE 8 [COMMISSION] 9 SECTION 2. Section 449.001, Government Code, is amended by 10 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as 11 12 follows: 13 (1) "Advisory committee" means the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee. 14 15 (1-a) "Commission" means the Texas Historical [Holocaust and Cenocide] Commission. 16 SECTION 3. Section 449.002, Government Code, is amended to 17 read as follows: 18 Sec. 449.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT [PROVISION]. The 19 advisory committee [Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission] is 20 21 subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). The advisory committee shall be reviewed during the period in which the commission is 22 23 reviewed [Unless continued in existence as provided by that commission is abolished and this chapter expires 24 chapter, the

S.B. No. 708 September 1, 2021]. 1 SECTION 4. Section 449.004, Government Code, is amended to 2 3 read as follows: 4 Sec. 449.004. ADVISORY COMMITTEE [COMPOSITION OF The Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory 5 COMMISSION]. (a) Committee is established as an advisory committee to the 6 7 commission. 8 (b) The advisory committee [commission] is composed of [18 members as follows: 9 [(1)] 15 [public] members appointed as follows: 10 (1) [(A)] five [public] members appointed by the 11 12 governor; (2) [(B)] five [public] members appointed by the 13 14 lieutenant governor; and (3) [(C)] five [public] members appointed by the 15 speaker of the house of representatives[; and 16 [(2) three ex officio members as follows: 17 [(A) the commissioner of education; 18 [(B) the commissioner of higher education; and 19 20 [(C) the executive director of the Texas Veterans 21 Commission. [(b) The speaker of the house of representatives shall 22 designate a member of the house and the lieutenant governor shall 23 24 designate a member of the senate to advise the commission]. 25 SECTION 5. Section 449.005, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 26 Sec. 449.005. ADVISORY COMMITTEE [PUBLIC] MEMBERS: 27

1 ELIGIBILITY; APPOINTMENT; VACANCY. (a) A person appointed as a
2 [public] member of the advisory committee [commission] must be a
3 resident of this state.

4 (b) <u>Members</u> [Public members] of the <u>advisory committee</u> 5 [commission] must include:

6 (1) persons who have served prominently as leaders of 7 or spokespersons for public or private organizations that serve 8 members of religious, ethnic, national heritage, or social groups 9 that were subjected to the Holocaust or other genocides;

10 (2) persons who have significant professional11 experience in the field of Holocaust or genocide education;

12 (3) persons who represent liberators of Holocaust or13 other genocide victims; and

14 (4) persons who have demonstrated a significant,15 particular interest in Holocaust or genocide education.

16 (c) Appointments of [public] members to the <u>advisory</u> 17 <u>committee</u> [commission] shall be made:

18 (1) without regard to the race, color, disability,19 sex, religion, age, or national origin of an appointee; and

20 (2) so that each geographic area of this state is
21 represented on the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission].

(d) The original appointing authority shall fill any
vacancy in <u>a</u> [an appointed] position on the <u>advisory committee</u>
[commission] for the unexpired portion of the term.

25 SECTION 6. Section 449.007, Government Code, is amended to 26 read as follows:

27 Sec. 449.007. REMOVAL OF <u>ADVISORY COMMITTEE</u> [PUBLIC]

1 MEMBER. (a) It is a ground for removal of a [public] member from 2 the advisory committee [commission] if the member:

3 (1) is ineligible for [public] membership under 4 Section 449.005(a);

5 (2) cannot because of illness or disability discharge 6 the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for which the 7 member is appointed; or

8 (3) is absent from more than three consecutive 9 regularly scheduled <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] meetings that 10 the member is eligible to attend during a calendar year unless the 11 absence is excused by majority vote of the <u>advisory committee</u> 12 [commission].

(b) The validity of an action of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] is not affected by the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of <u>an advisory committee</u> [a commission] member exists.

(c) If a member of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] has knowledge that a potential ground for removal exists, the member shall notify the presiding officer of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] of the potential ground. The presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a potential ground for removal exists.

23 SECTION 7. Section 449.008, Government Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

25 Sec. 449.008. TERM OF <u>ADVISORY COMMITTEE</u> [PUBLIC] MEMBER. 26 (a) <u>Members</u> [Public members] of the <u>advisory committee</u> 27 [commission] serve staggered four-year terms with the terms of

1 seven or eight members expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered
2 year.

3 (b) <u>An advisory committee</u> [<u>A public</u>] member is eligible for
4 reappointment to another term or part of a term.

5 (c) <u>An advisory committee</u> [<u>A public</u>] member may not serve 6 more than two consecutive terms. For purposes of this prohibition, 7 a member is considered to have served a term only if the member has 8 served more than half of the term.

9 SECTION 8. Section 449.009, Government Code, is amended to 10 read as follows:

11 Sec. 449.009. OFFICERS; SUBCOMMITTEES. (a) The governor 12 shall designate a [public] member of the <u>advisory committee</u> 13 [commission] as presiding officer to serve in that capacity at the 14 pleasure of the governor.

15 (b) The presiding officer of the <u>advisory committee</u> 16 [commission] may appoint a subcommittee for any purpose consistent 17 with the duties of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] under this 18 chapter.

SECTION 9. Section 449.010, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 449.010. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. [(a)] A [public] member of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred by the member while transacting <u>advisory</u> <u>committee</u> [commission] business, as provided by the General Appropriations Act.

[(b) An ex officio member's service on the commission is an

additional duty of the underlying position that qualifies the 1 member for service on the commission. The entitlement of an ex 2 officio member to compensation or to reimbursement for travel 3 expenses incurred while transacting commission business is 4 governed by the law that applies to the member's service in that 5 underlying position, and any payment to the member for either 6 purpose must be made from money that may be used for the purpose and 7 8 is available to the state agency that the member serves in that underlying position.] 9

10 SECTION 10. Section 449.011, Government Code, is amended to 11 read as follows:

Sec. 449.011. MEETINGS; QUORUM; VOTING; PUBLIC ACCESS. (a) The <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] shall meet at least quarterly at the times and places in this state that the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] designates.

16 (b) Seven voting members of the <u>advisory committee</u> 17 [commission] constitute a quorum for transacting <u>advisory</u> 18 <u>committee</u> [commission] business.

19 (c) [An ex officio member of the commission may not vote on 20 commission business.

[(d)] The <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] shall develop and implement policies that provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to appear before the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] and speak on any issue under the jurisdiction of the <u>advisory</u> <u>committee</u> [commission].

26 SECTION 11. Subchapter A, Chapter 449, Government Code, is 27 amended by adding Section 449.0115 to read as follows:

S.B. No. 708 Sec. 449.0115. TRAINING. Each member of the advisory 1 committee shall complete the training program prescribed by the 2 commission. The program must provide the member with information 3 4 on: 5 (1) the role and duties of advisory committee members; 6 (2) the functions of the advisory committee; and (3) the commission's oversight of the advisory 7 8 committee. SECTION 12. Section 449.012, Government Code, is amended to 9 10 read as follows: Sec. 449.012. PERSONNEL [COORDINATOR]. The commission 11 12 shall: (1) hire [Texas Historical Commission shall provide] 13 14 personnel as necessary to support the advisory committee in 15 fulfilling its duties under this chapter, including establishing staffing levels, position titles, and salaries of the employees and 16 17 managing and evaluating the employees; and (2) provide other administrative support to the 18 19 advisory committee as necessary [one part-time employee to serve as the coordinator for the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission to 20 21 transact commission business]. SECTION 13. Subchapter A, Chapter 449, Government Code, is 22 23 amended by adding Section 449.013 to read as follows: 24 Sec. 449.013. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110 does not apply to the advisory committee. 25 26 SECTION 14. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 449, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 27

3	SECTION 15. Subchapter B, Chapter 449, Government Code, is
4	amended by adding Section 449.0515 to read as follows:
5	Sec. 449.0515. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The commission
6	and advisory committee shall:
7	(1) enter into a memorandum of understanding to
8	establish the roles and responsibilities of the commission and
9	advisory committee under this chapter, including necessary
10	policies and procedures; and
11	(2) periodically review and update the memorandum as
12	necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter.
13	SECTION 16. Section 449.052, Government Code, is amended to
14	read as follows:
15	Sec. 449.052. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF <u>ADVISORY</u>
16	COMMITTEE AND COMMISSION. (a) The advisory committee, under
17	<u>direction of the</u> commission <u></u> , shall:
18	(1) provide advice and assistance to public and
19	private primary and secondary schools and institutions of higher
20	education in this state regarding implementation of Holocaust and
21	genocide courses of study and awareness programs;
22	(2) meet with appropriate representatives of public
23	and private organizations, including service organizations, to
24	provide information on and to assist in planning, coordinating, or
25	modifying Holocaust and genocide courses of study and awareness
26	programs;
27	(3) [determine which, if any, existing Holocaust or

1 other genocide memorials, exhibits, or other resources could be 2 included in or used to support Holocaust and genocide courses of 3 study and awareness programs;

4 [(4)] compile a list of volunteers, such as Holocaust 5 or other genocide survivors, liberators of concentration camps, 6 scholars, and members of the clergy, who have agreed to share, in 7 classrooms, seminars, exhibits, or workshops, their verifiable 8 knowledge and experiences regarding the Holocaust or other 9 genocide;

10 <u>(4)</u> [(5)] coordinate events in this state memorializing the Holocaust and other genocides on January 27, 11 12 International Holocaust Remembrance Day, on the Days of Remembrance established by the United States Congress, or on any other day 13 14 designated by the advisory committee [commission] for that purpose; 15 and

16 (5) [(6)] solicit volunteers to participate in 17 commemorative events designed to enhance public awareness of the 18 continuing significance of the Holocaust and other genocides.

19 (b) In implementing Subsection <u>(a)</u> [(a)(3)], the <u>advisory</u> 20 <u>committee</u>, <u>under direction of the</u> commission<u></u>, may contact and 21 cooperate with:

(1) existing public or private Holocaust or other
 genocide resource organizations, including the United States
 Holocaust Memorial Museum;

(2) other museums, centers, and organizations based in
 this state;

27 (3) state agencies that carry out the educational

functions of the state delegated under the Education Code,
 including the Texas Education Agency and the Texas Higher Education
 Coordinating Board; [and]

4

(4) the Texas Veterans Commission; and

5 (5) members of the United States Congress and of the 6 legislature of this state.

7 (c) The commission shall adopt rules as necessary <u>governing</u>
8 <u>the operation of the advisory committee</u> [for its own procedures].
9 <u>The rules may include the delegation of certain final decisions and</u>
10 <u>authorities to the advisory committee that are appropriate given</u>
11 <u>the committee's advisory status.</u>

12 (d) [The commission may appoint advisory committees to 13 advise the commission.

14 [(e)] The commission, in coordination with the advisory 15 committee, shall adopt rules, policies, and procedures for the [may provide] matching grants program established to assist in the 16 17 implementation of the [commission's] goals and objectives of this chapter. The commission must prescribe for the program an annual 18 budget, a funding cycle, goals, award eligibility criteria, grant 19 application and selection processes, requirements for in-kind 20 services and matching fund waivers, maximum grant awards, conflict 21 of interest policies, data collection and evaluation, and audits of 22 23 grant recipients.

24 SECTION 17. Section 449.053, Government Code, is amended to 25 read as follows:

26 Sec. 449.053. FUNDING. (a) The commission may accept gifts 27 and grants from a public or private source <u>on behalf of the advisory</u>

1 <u>committee</u> for the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] to use in 2 performing the [commission's powers and] duties <u>assigned to the</u> 3 <u>advisory committee</u> under this chapter. The commission may 4 participate in the establishment and operation of an affiliated 5 nonprofit organization whose purpose is to raise funds for or 6 provide services or other benefits to the <u>advisory committee</u> 7 [commission].

8 (b) All legislative appropriations to [The Texas Historical Commission may provide staff and may] support the functions and 9 10 activities of the advisory committee shall be made as part of the commission's legislative appropriations request process and 11 12 disbursed to the commission [Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission from money available to the Texas Historical Commission 13 that may be used for this purpose. The legislature may also 14 specifically appropriate money to the Texas Historical Commission 15 16 to provide staff and to otherwise support functions and activities 17 of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission].

SECTION 18. Subchapter B, Chapter 449, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 449.054 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 449.054. COMMISSION REPORT; AUDITS. (a) The commission</u> 21 <u>shall include the activities of the advisory committee as</u> 22 <u>authorized by Section 449.052 in the report the commission is</u> 23 <u>required to submit under Section 442.005(n).</u>

(b) The advisory committee is subject to audit and
 evaluation by the commission or another appropriate state agency,
 including the state auditor's office.

27

SECTION 19. Section 29.9072(c), Education Code, is amended

1 to read as follows:

2 (c) Holocaust Remembrance Week shall include 3 age-appropriate instruction, as determined by each school 4 district. Instruction shall include:

5 (1) information about the history of and lessons6 learned from the Holocaust;

7 (2) participation, in person or using technology, in8 learning projects about the Holocaust; and

9 (3) the use of materials developed or approved by the 10 Texas Holocaust and Genocide <u>Advisory Committee</u> [Commission].

SECTION 20. The following provisions of the Government Code are repealed:

(1) Section 449.003;

(2) Section 449.006; and

15 (3) Section 449.051.

16 SECTION 21. (a) On the effective date of this Act, a public 17 member of the former Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission 18 becomes a member of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory 19 Committee and continues the member's term on the advisory committee 20 in accordance with the original appointment on the commission.

(b) Section 449.0115, Government Code, as added by this Act,
applies to a member of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory
Committee appointed before, on, or after the effective date of this
Act.

(c) Not later than September 1, 2021, the Texas Historical
Commission and the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee
shall develop and enter into a memorandum of understanding as

required by Section 449.0515, Government Code, as added by this
 Act. Before the effective date of this Act, the Texas Historical
 Commission and Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission may begin
 developing the memorandum of understanding.

5 (d) Not later than December 1, 2022, the Texas Historical 6 Commission and the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee 7 shall provide a written report to the Sunset Advisory Commission on 8 the progress of the Texas Historical Commission and the Texas 9 Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee in implementing the 10 changes in law made by this Act. The report must identify any 11 obstacles or concerns encountered in implementing the changes.

(e) All contracts and agreements of the Texas Holocaust and
Genocide Commission are continued in effect as contracts and
agreements of the Texas Historical Commission.

(f) The Texas Historical Commission shall coordinate with the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee and the Legislative Budget Board to propose goals, strategies, and performance measures for the advisory committee in the commission's legislative appropriations request for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2025.

21 SECTION 22. As soon as practicable after the effective date 22 of this Act, the Texas Historical Commission shall perform an 23 evaluation of the job titles and salaries of personnel employed by 24 the commission to support the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory 25 Committee under Section 449.012, Government Code, as amended by 26 this Act, in order to ensure that the salaries and titles are 27 commensurate with other commission employees with comparable

duties.
 SECTION 23. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
