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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the Brazos River Authority, following recommendations
3	of the Sunset Advisory Commission; specifying grounds for the
4	removal of a member of the board of directors.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 8502, Special District Local Laws Code,
7	is amended by adding Sections 8502.0091, 8502.0092, 8502.0093,
8	8502.0094, and 8502.0095 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 8502.0091. GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS. (a) It
10	is a ground for removal from the board that a director:
11	(1) does not have at the time of taking office the
12	qualifications required by Section 8502.009;
13	(2) does not maintain during service on the board the
14	qualifications required by Section 8502.009;
15	(3) is ineligible for directorship under Chapter 171,
16	Local Government Code;
17	(4) cannot, because of illness or disability,
18	discharge the director's duties for a substantial part of the
19	director's term; or
20	(5) is absent from more than half of the regularly

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scheduled board meetings that the director is eligible to attend

during a calendar year without an excuse approved by a majority vote

(b) The validity of an action of the board is not affected by

- 1 the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of a director
- 2 exists.
- 3 (c) If the general manager has knowledge that a potential
- 4 ground for removal exists, the general manager shall notify the
- 5 presiding officer of the board of the potential ground. The
- 6 presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney
- 7 general that a potential ground for removal exists. If the
- 8 potential ground for removal involves the presiding officer, the
- 9 general manager shall notify the next highest ranking director, who
- 10 shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a
- 11 potential ground for removal exists.
- 12 Sec. 8502.0092. DIRECTOR TRAINING. (a) A person who is
- 13 appointed to and qualifies for office as a director may not vote,
- 14 deliberate, or be counted as a director in attendance at a board
- 15 meeting until the person completes a training program that complies
- 16 with this section.
- 17 (b) The training program must provide the person with
- 18 information regarding:
- 19 (1) the law governing authority operations;
- 20 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the
- 21 authority;
- 22 (3) the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking
- 23 authority of the authority;
- 24 (4) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
- 25 authority;
- 26 (5) the requirements of:
- 27 (A) laws relating to open meetings, public

- 1 information, administrative procedure, and disclosure of conflicts
- 2 of interest; and
- 3 (B) other laws applicable to members of the
- 4 governing body of a river authority in performing their duties; and
- 5 (6) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
- 6 authority or the Texas Ethics Commission.
- 7 (c) A person appointed to the board is entitled to
- 8 reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred in attending the
- 9 training program regardless of whether the attendance at the
- 10 program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office.
- 11 (d) The general manager of the authority shall create a
- 12 training manual that includes the information required by
- 13 Subsection (b). The general manager shall distribute a copy of the
- 14 training manual annually to each director. Each director shall
- 15 sign and submit to the general manager a statement acknowledging
- 16 that the director received and has reviewed the training manual.
- 17 Sec. 8502.0093. POLICIES TO SEPARATE POLICY-MAKING AND
- 18 STAFF FUNCTIONS. The board shall develop and implement policies
- 19 that clearly separate the policy-making responsibilities of the
- 20 board and the management responsibilities of the general manager
- 21 and the staff of the authority.
- Sec. 8502.0094. COMPLAINTS. (a) The authority shall
- 23 maintain a system to promptly and efficiently act on complaints
- 24 filed with the authority. The authority shall maintain information
- 25 about parties to the complaint, the subject matter of the
- 26 complaint, a summary of the results of the review or investigation
- 27 of the complaint, and its disposition.

- 1 (b) The authority shall make information describing its
- 2 procedures for complaint investigation and resolution available to
- 3 the public.
- 4 (c) The authority shall periodically notify the complaint
- 5 parties of the status of the complaint until final disposition
- 6 unless the notice would jeopardize an investigation.
- 7 Sec. 8502.0095. PUBLIC TESTIMONY. The board shall develop
- 8 and implement policies that provide the public with a reasonable
- 9 opportunity to appear before the board and to speak on any issue
- 10 under the jurisdiction of the authority.
- 11 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Section 8502.0092, Special
- 12 District Local Laws Code, as added by this Act, a person serving on
- 13 the board of directors of the Brazos River Authority may vote,
- 14 deliberate, and be counted as a director in attendance at a meeting
- 15 of the board until December 1, 2021.
- 16 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
- 17 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 18 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 19 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 20 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 21 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 22 Government Code.
- 23 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 24 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 25 Environmental Quality.
- 26 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 27 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the

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- 1 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 2 representatives within the required time.
- 3 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 4 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
- 5 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
- 6 and accomplished.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
