3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 203.256, Occupations Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 203.256. TRAINING IN NEWBORN SCREENING,
7	ADMINISTRATION OF CERTAIN DRUGS, AND BASIC LIFE SUPPORT
8	CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION. A person who practices midwifery in
9	this state must provide the department with satisfactory evidence
10	that the person:
11	(1) is trained to <u>:</u>
12	(A) perform the newborn screening tests under
13	Section 203.354 or has made arrangements for the performance of
14	those tests; and

- (B) administer the drugs described by Section 15
- 203.3525; and 16
- 17 (2) holds:
- (A) a current certificate issued by the American 18
- 19 Heart Association in basic life support cardiopulmonary
- 20 resuscitation; or
- 21 another form of certification acceptable to
- the department that demonstrates proficiency in basic life support 22
- cardiopulmonary resuscitation for adults and children. 23
- SECTION 2. Section 203.304, Occupations Code, is amended by 24

- 1 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 2 (a-1) The commission by rule shall require a licensed
- 3 midwife to complete, as part of the minimum hours required to renew
- 4 a license:
- 5 (1) a course in pharmacology; and
- 6 (2) training in the administration of the drugs
- 7 described by Section 203.3525.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 203, Occupations Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 203.3525 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 203.3525. ADMINISTRATION OF CERTAIN DRUGS. (a) A
- 11 midwife may administer:
- 12 (1) a drug commonly used in labor or postpartum care,
- 13 including an anti-hemorrhagic drug, intravenous fluids, or a local
- 14 anesthetic; or
- (2) a prophylactic drug that meets the applicable
- 16 standard of care for a woman or newborn and is approved by the
- 17 Department of State Health Services.
- 18 (b) The administration of a drug by a midwife under this
- 19 section does not constitute the practice of medicine as defined by
- 20 Subtitle B.
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 203.401, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 203.401. PROHIBITED PRACTICES. A midwife may not:
- 24 (1) provide midwifery care in violation of commission
- 25 rule, except in an emergency that poses an immediate threat to the
- 26 life of a woman or newborn;
- 27 (2) administer a prescription drug to a client other

- 1 than:
- 2 (A) a drug administered under the supervision of
- 3 a licensed physician in accordance with state law;
- 4 (B) prophylaxis approved by the Department of
- 5 State Health Services to prevent ophthalmia neonatorum; [or]
- 6 (C) oxygen administered in accordance with
- 7 commission rule; or
- 8 (D) a drug described by Section 203.3525;
- 9 (3) use forceps or a surgical instrument for a
- 10 procedure other than cutting the umbilical cord or providing
- 11 emergency first aid during delivery;
- 12 (4) remove placenta by invasive techniques;
- 13 (5) use a mechanical device or medicine to advance or
- 14 retard labor or delivery; or
- 15 (6) make on a birth certificate a false statement or
- 16 false record in violation of Section 195.003, Health and Safety
- 17 Code.
- 18 SECTION 5. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas
- 19 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules as
- 20 required by Section 203.304(a-1), Occupations Code, as added by
- 21 this Act.
- SECTION 6. Section 203.304(a-1), Occupations Code, as added
- 23 by this Act, applies only to the renewal of a midwife license on or
- 24 after March 1, 2022. The renewal of a license before March 1, 2022,
- 25 is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective
- 26 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 27 purpose.

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- 1 SECTION 7. Section 203.401, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 2 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after March 1,
- 3 2022. Conduct that occurs before March 1, 2022, is governed by the
- 4 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 5 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 8. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 7 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
- 8 (b) Section 203.256, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 9 Act, and Section 203.3525, Occupations Code, as added by this Act,
- 10 take effect March 1, 2022.
