## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to eligibility for job-training programs provided under 3 the self-sufficiency fund. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 309.002(a), Labor Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: funds, 7 (a) Subject to the availability of the 8 self-sufficiency fund is created as an account in the general revenue fund for use by public community and technical colleges, 9 10 community-based organizations, and state extension agencies to develop [for certain recipients of financial assistance under 11 Chapter 31, Human Resources Code, customized] job-training 12 13 programs in which individuals who are identified by the commission as being low-income or at risk of becoming dependent on public 14 15 assistance benefits are [the recipients will be] provided job training by: 16 17 (1)an entity that develops a job-training program under this section; 18 19 (2) a small or medium-sized business or trade union; 20 or 21 (3) an informal partnership between an entity that 22 develops a job-training program under this section and a small or medium-sized business network or consortium. 23 SECTION 2. Section 309.003(b), Labor Code, is amended to 24

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1 read as follows:

An entity that receives money from the fund for a 2 (b) job-training program shall work in conjunction with employers to 3 place participants who successfully complete [graduates of] the 4 program in positions of employment in which the participants 5 [graduates] will earn [be earning] wages sufficient to enable the 6 7 participants [graduates] to become independent of or avoid becoming dependent on benefits under the financial assistance program 8 9 established under Chapter 31, Human Resources Code, and if applicable, benefits [assistance] provided under the supplemental 10 11 nutrition assistance [<del>food stamp</del>] program established [administered by the Texas Department of Human Services] under 12 13 Chapter 33, Human Resources Code.

14 SECTION 3. Section 309.004, Labor Code, is amended to read 15 as follows:

Sec. 309.004. RULEMAKING AUTHORITY. The commission shall adopt rules to implement this chapter, including rules to:

18 (1) identify individuals who are low-income or at risk
19 of becoming dependent on public assistance benefits; and

20 (2) determine which <u>individuals identified under</u> 21 <u>Subdivision (1)</u> [recipients of financial assistance under Chapter 22 <del>31, Human Resources Code,</del>] are eligible to participate in 23 job-training programs developed with money from the fund.

SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or

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authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
 waiver or authorization is granted.

3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
