A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to eligibility for job-training programs provided under the self-sufficiency fund. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 309.002(a), Labor Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) Subject to the availability of funds, the self-sufficiency fund is created as an account in the general 8 revenue fund for use by public community and technical colleges, 9 community-based organizations, and state extension agencies to 10 11 develop [for certain recipients of financial assistance under 12 Chapter 31, Human Resources Code, customized] job-training programs in which individuals who are identified by the commission 13 14 as being low-income or at risk of becoming dependent on public assistance benefits are [the recipients will be] provided job 15 16 training by: (1) an entity that develops a job-training program 17 18 under this section; (2) a small or medium-sized business or trade union; 19 20 or 21 (3) an informal partnership between an entity that develops a job-training program under this section and a small or 22 23 medium-sized business network or consortium. SECTION 2. Section 309.003(b), Labor Code, is amended to 24

2 An entity that receives money from the fund for a (b) 3 job-training program shall work in conjunction with employers to place participants who successfully complete [graduates of] the 4 program in positions of employment in which the participants 5 [graduates] will earn [be earning] wages sufficient to enable the 6 participants [graduates] to become independent of or avoid becoming 7 dependent on benefits under the financial assistance program 8 under Chapter 31, Human Resources Code, and if established 9 applicable, <u>benefits</u> [assistance] provided under the <u>supplemental</u> 10 nutrition assistance [food stamp] program established 11 [administered by the Texas Department of Human Services] under 12 13 Chapter 33, Human Resources Code.

14 SECTION 3. Section 309.004, Labor Code, is amended to read 15 as follows:

Sec. 309.004. RULEMAKING AUTHORITY. The commission shall adopt rules to implement this chapter, including rules to:

18 (1) identify individuals who are low-income or at risk
 19 of becoming dependent on public assistance benefits; and

20 <u>(2)</u> determine which <u>individuals identified under</u> 21 <u>Subdivision (1)</u> [recipients of financial assistance under Chapter 22 31, Human Resources Code,] are eligible to participate in 23 job-training programs developed with money from the fund.

SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or

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- authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
