S.B. No. 809

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to health care provider reporting of federal money received for the coronavirus disease public health emergency. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended by adding Chapter 81A to read as follows: 6 7 CHAPTER 81A. CORONAVIRUS DISEASE PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY REPORTING Sec. 81A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 8 (1) "Coronavirus d<u>isease public health emergency"</u> 9 10 means the period: 11 (A) beginning on the date the public health 12 emergency declared by the United States secretary of health and human services under Section 319, Public Health Service Act (42 13 U.S.C. Section 247d), on January 31, 2020, with respect to the 14 coronavirus disease (COVID-19) took effect; and 15 16 (B) ending on the earlier of: (i) the date the public health emergency 17 described by Paragraph (A) of this subdivision ends; or 18 (ii) January 1, 2023. 19 (2) "Health care provider" means a person that is 20 licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of this 21 state to provide health care services in the ordinary course of 22 23 business or practice of a profession. 24 Sec. 81A.002. HEALTH CARE PROVIDER REPORT. (a) A health

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care provider that receives federal money for assisting health care 1 providers during the coronavirus disease public health emergency, 2 including money received under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and 3 Economic Security Act (15 U.S.C. Section 9001 et seq.) and the 4 Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Pub. L. No. 116-260), shall 5 report the money received to the commission on a monthly basis. 6 (b) Each quarter, the commission shall compile the 7 information described by Subsection (a) into a written report 8 provided to: 9 10 (1) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives; 11 12 (2) the Legislative Budget Board; and (3) the standing committees of the legislature with 13 14 primary jurisdiction over state finance and public health. 15 Sec. 81A.003. DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY LICENSING AUTHORITY. The appropriate licensing authority may take disciplinary action 16 17 against a health care provider that violates this chapter as if the provider violated an applicable licensing law. 18 19 Sec. 81A.004. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September 1, 2023. 20

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
