A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the course information required to be posted on a public
3	institution of higher education's Internet website.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 51.974, Education Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsections (a), (b), and (f) and adding Subsections (f-1)
7	and (f-2) to read as follows:
8	(a) Each institution of higher education, other than a

- 8 (a) Each institution of higher education, other than a 9 medical and dental unit, as defined by Section 61.003, shall make available to the public on the institution's Internet website the following information for each [undergraduate classroom] course offered for credit by the institution:
- 13 (1) a syllabus that:
- 14 (A) satisfies any standards adopted by the
- 15 institution;
- 16 (B) provides a brief description of each major
- 17 course requirement, including each major assignment and
- 18 examination;
- 19 (C) lists any required or recommended reading;
- 20 and
- 21 (D) provides a general description of the subject
- 22 matter of each lecture or discussion;
- 23 (2) a curriculum vitae of each regular instructor that
- 24 lists the instructor's:

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- 1 (A) postsecondary education;
- 2 (B) teaching experience; and
- 3 (C) significant professional publications; and
- 4 (3) if available, a departmental budget report of the 5 department under which the course is offered, from the most recent 6 semester or other academic term during which the institution
- 7 offered the course.
- 8 (b) The information required by Subsection (a) must be:
- 9 (1) accessible from the institution's Internet website
 10 home page [by use of not more than three links];
- 11 (2) <u>clearly labeled as "public course and syllabus</u>
- 12 information";
- 13 (3) searchable by keywords and phrases; and
- 14 $\underline{(4)}$ [$\overline{(3)}$] accessible to the public without requiring
- 15 registration or use of a user name, a password, or another user
- 16 identification.
- 17 (f) Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, each
- 18 institution of higher education shall submit a written report
- 19 regarding the institution's compliance with this section to the
- 20 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 21 representatives, $[\frac{and}{}]$ the presiding officer of each legislative
- 22 standing committee with primary jurisdiction over higher
- 23 education, and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
- 24 (f-1) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 25 monitor each institution of higher education's compliance with this
- 26 section and make available to the public on the coordinating
- 27 board's Internet website:

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- 1 (1) a list indicating each institution of higher
- 2 education's compliance or noncompliance with this section; and
- 3 (2) a copy of each report submitted to the
- 4 coordinating board under Subsection (f).
- 5 (f-2) Not later than July 1 of each year, the Texas Higher
- 6 Education Coordinating Board shall notify the comptroller of each
- 7 <u>institution of higher education that fails to comply with the</u>
- 8 requirements under Subsection (a) or (b). For each institution for
- 9 which that notice is received, the comptroller shall, for each
- 10 state fiscal year beginning after receipt, withhold one percent of
- 11 the total amount of general revenue funds appropriated directly to
- 12 the institution for that fiscal year until the coordinating board
- 13 notifies the comptroller that the institution is in compliance with
- 14 the requirements under Subsections (a) and (b).
- SECTION 2. Section 51.974, Education Code, as amended by
- 16 this Act, applies beginning with the 2022 spring semester.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
