2 SECTION 3. Section 43.856, Parks and Wildlife Code, is 3 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to 4 read as follows:

5 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) or (c), a person 6 who violates this subchapter or a rule adopted under this 7 subchapter commits an offense that is a Class C Parks and Wildlife 8 Code misdemeanor.

9 (c) If it is shown at the trial of the defendant for a violation of this subchapter or a rule adopted under this 10 subchapter that the defendant has engaged in a commercial activity 11 without holding a required permit and the defendant has been 12 previously convicted of a violation of this subchapter or a rule 13 adopted under this subchapter, on conviction the defendant shall be 14 15 punished for a Class B Parks and Wildlife Code misdemeanor. 16 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
