- 12 governed the office, and that prior law is continued in effect for
- 13 that purpose. If unelected commissioners vacate their positions or
- 14 are otherwise removed or disqualified under prior law, the governor
- 15 shall fill the vacancy in a manner provided by law with the advice
- 16 and consent of the senate.
- 17 SECTION 8. Except as otherwise specified, this Act takes
- 18 effect September 1, 2021.
