## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to the management and operation by The University of Texas 2 3 System of a multi-institution center in the city of Laredo. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter M, 5 Chapter 74, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER M. UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS SYSTEM MULTI-INSTITUTION [HEALTH 7 SCIENCE] CENTER IN LAREDO [AT SAN ANTONIO CAMPUS EXTENSION] 8 SECTION 2. Section 74.701, Education Code, is amended to 9 read as follows: 10 Sec. 74.701. AUTHORITY ТО ESTABLISH 11 CENTER [CAMPUS 12 EXTENSION]. The board of regents of The University of Texas System 13 shall establish and operate a multi-institution center [campus extension of The University of Texas Health Science Center at San 14 15 Antonio] in the city of Laredo if: (1) a public or private entity offers the board of 16 17 regents sufficient land in that city to construct a center [campus extension]; and 18 19 (2) public or private entities agree to provide funds necessary to construct an administrative building for the center 20 21 [campus extension]. 22 SECTION 3. Section 74.702, Education Code, is amended to 23 read as follows: Sec. 74.702. MANAGEMENT AND OPERATION OF CENTER [CAMPUS 24

1 EXTENSION]. (a) The board of regents may exercise any power 2 granted to the board under Subchapter D in establishing and 3 operating the <u>center</u> [campus extension].

(b) The board of regents <u>may</u> [shall] assign responsibility
for management of the <u>center to a component institution of the</u>
<u>system</u> [campus extension to The University of Texas Health Science
Center at San Antonio].

8 (c) The operating costs of the <u>center</u> [<del>campus extension</del>] 9 shall be paid from [<del>the operating funds of The University of Texas</del> 10 <del>Health Science Center at San Antonio for that purpose and from</del>] 11 available funds from any public or private entity.

The primary purpose of the <u>center</u> [campus extension] is 12 (d) to <u>host</u> [support] educational activities, conduct and facilitate 13 research, and engage in community outreach. Component institutions 14 15 of the system may use the center in accordance with its primary 16 purpose [The campus extension may be used] to provide undergraduate and graduate medical and dental education, including residency 17 training programs, and other levels of health education work in 18 collaboration with any public institution of higher education 19 considered appropriate by the board of regents 20 [<del>Texas A&M</del> International University or any component institution of The Texas 21 A&M University System or The University of Texas System]. 22

23 SECTION 4. Section 74.703, Education Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

25 Sec. 74.703. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The board of regents may 26 accept and administer gifts and grants from any public or private 27 person or entity for the use and benefit of the <u>center</u> [<del>campus</del>

extension], including accepting and administering gifts and grants
 of land and physical facilities.

3 SECTION 5. Section 74.704(a), Education Code, is amended to 4 read as follows:

physical facilities 5 (a) The of the center [campus 6 extension] used in teaching and research programs, including 7 libraries, auditoriums, research facilities, and health education buildings, may be provided by a public or private entity. The board 8 of regents may [is authorized to] lease the facilities that are to 9 be used as the physical facilities of [<del>campus</del> 10 the center 11 extension].

SECTION 6. Section 63.102(c), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

The amount available for distribution from each fund may 14 (c) be appropriated only for research and other programs that are 15 16 conducted by the institution or components for which the fund is established and that benefit the public health. The comptroller or 17 the governing board shall report to the legislature the amount of 18 funds that are eligible for appropriation. An amount appropriated 19 20 from the fund established for The University of Texas Health 21 Science Center at San Antonio may be used to establish, maintain, and operate a children's cancer center. An amount appropriated 22 23 from the funds established for the component institutions of The 24 University of Texas System may be used to maintain, operate, and conduct health education programs and other related work at the 25 system's multi-institution center [and the campus extension] in the 26 27 city of Laredo. An amount appropriated from the funds established

for the components of the Texas Tech University Health Sciences 1 Center located in El Paso and for The University of Texas at El Paso 2 may be used for the establishment and operation of an institute of 3 4 public health in El Paso. An amount appropriated from the fund established for the components of the Texas Tech University Health 5 6 Sciences Center at locations other than El Paso may be used for 7 research and other programs that benefit the public health in areas outside El Paso. An amount appropriated from the fund established 8 9 for The Texas A&M University Health Science Center may be used for 10 the establishment and operation of the Coastal Bend Health Education Center in Corpus Christi. 11

SECTION 7. Section 74.705, Education Code, is repealed.
 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
