2 relating to the provision of counseling services by certain

- providers under Medicaid and reimbursement for those services. 3
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 32.027, Human Resources Code, is amended
- by amending Subsection (1) and adding Subsection (m) to read as 6
- 7 follows:

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- Subject to appropriations, the commission shall assure 8
- that a recipient of medical assistance under this chapter may 9
- select a licensed psychologist, a licensed marriage and family 10
- 11 therapist, as defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code, a
- 12 licensed professional counselor, as defined by Section 503.002,
- Occupations Code, or a licensed clinical [master] social worker, as 13
- 14 defined by Section 505.002, Occupations Code, to perform any health
- care service or procedure covered under the medical assistance 15
- 16 program if the selected person is authorized by law to perform the
- service or procedure. This subsection shall be liberally 17
- construed. 18
- (m) The commission shall assure that a recipient of medical 19
- assistance under this chapter may select the following to perform 20
- any health care service or procedure covered under the medical 21
- assistance program if the selected person is licensed and 22
- 23 authorized by law to perform the service or procedure:
- 24 (1) a licensed marriage and family therapist

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- 1 associate, as defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code, who is
- 2 working toward fulfilling the supervised practice requirements to
- 3 be licensed as a licensed marriage and family therapist, as defined
- 4 by that section;
- 5 (2) a licensed master social worker, as defined by
- 6 Section 505.002, Occupations Code, who is actively pursuing the
- 7 education and training required to be licensed as a licensed
- 8 clinical social worker, as defined by that section; or
- 9 (3) a licensed professional counselor intern, as
- 10 described by 22 T.A.C. Chapter 681, who is working toward
- 11 fulfilling the supervised practice requirements to be licensed as a
- 12 licensed professional counselor, as defined by Section 503.002,
- 13 Occupations Code.
- 14 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- is amended by adding Section 32.079 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 32.079. REIMBURSEMENT FOR CERTAIN COUNSELING
- 17 SERVICES. (a) The commission shall provide reimbursement under
- 18 the medical assistance program to a provider described by Section
- 19 32.027(1) who is a licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed
- 20 professional counselor, or licensed clinical social worker, is
- 21 <u>selected</u> by a recipient of medical assistance, and provides
- 22 counseling services covered under the medical assistance program
- 23 that the provider is authorized by law to perform. The commission
- 24 shall ensure that the provider is reimbursed at a rate equal to the
- 25 reimbursement rate established for a licensed psychiatrist or
- 26 licensed psychologist for providing similar services.
- 27 (b) The commission shall provide reimbursement under the

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- 1 medical assistance program to a provider described by Section
- 2 32.027(m) who is selected by a recipient of medical assistance and
- 3 who provides counseling services covered under the medical
- 4 assistance program that the provider is authorized by law to
- 5 perform. The commission shall ensure that the provider is
- 6 reimbursed at a rate equal to 70 percent of the reimbursement rate
- 7 established for a licensed psychiatrist or licensed psychologist
- 8 for providing similar services.
- 9 (c) This section shall be liberally construed.
- 10 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 11 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 12 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 13 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 14 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 15 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
