A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to contracts for fingerprinting services entered into by
3	the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 411.0865 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 411.0865. CONTRACTS FOR FINGERPRINTING SERVICES. (a)
8	If the department enters into a contract with a vendor to provide
9	fingerprinting services throughout this state for use in accessing
10	criminal history record information, including a contract entered
11	<pre>into under Section 2157.068, the department shall:</pre>
12	(1) include in the contract a provision that:
13	(A) requires notice to the public of a permanent
14	closure of a location accessible to the public that provides
15	fingerprinting services at least 45 days before the date on which
16	the location closes;
17	(B) requires a mobile unit to provide
18	fingerprinting services in or as near as practicable to the area of
19	a location accessible to the public that permanently closes until a
20	replacement location is opened in that area at full capacity if the
21	closure would cause the vendor to not meet contractual coverage
22	requirements; and
23	(C) allows the department to contract with a
24	second vendor to provide fingerprinting services or to provide

- 1 fingerprinting services by other means if the department determines
- 2 that the original vendor has not fulfilled the contract in a
- 3 <u>reasonable manner; and</u>
- 4 (2) annually review and prepare a report on the
- 5 services provided by the vendor under the contract that includes a
- 6 determination on the vendor's ability to adequately address the
- 7 need for fingerprinting services throughout this state based on:
- 8 <u>(A) the availability of fingerprinting</u>
- 9 appointments throughout this state, including any wait times for
- 10 appointments at locations; and
- 11 (B) a study of the miles required to travel
- 12 throughout this state in order to receive fingerprinting services
- 13 and whether there are short-term or chronic gaps in coverage in
- 14 certain areas of this state.
- 15 (b) The department shall provide the report prepared under
- 16 Subsection (a)(2) to the governor and members of the legislature.
- 17 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 18 to a contract for which the Department of Public Safety of the State
- 19 of Texas first advertises or otherwise solicits bids, proposals,
- 20 offers, or qualifications or makes a similar solicitation on or
- 21 after the effective date of this Act. A contract for which the
- 22 Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas first advertises
- 23 or otherwise solicits bids, proposals, offers, or qualifications or
- 24 makes a similar solicitation before the effective date of this Act
- 25 is governed by the law in effect on the date the advertisement or
- 26 solicitation is made, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 27 purpose.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
