## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to contracts for fingerprinting services entered into by
3	the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 411.0865 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 411.0865. CONTRACTS FOR FINGERPRINTING SERVICES. (a)
8	If the department enters into a contract with a vendor to provide
9	fingerprinting services throughout this state for use in accessing
10	criminal history record information, including a contract entered
11	into under Section 2157.068, the department shall:
12	(1) include in the contract a provision that:
13	(A) requires notice to the public of a closure of
14	a location providing fingerprinting services at least 45 days
15	before the date on which the location closes;
16	(B) requires a mobile unit to provide
17	fingerprinting services in or near the area of a location that
18	closes until a replacement location is opened at full capacity; and
19	(C) allows the department to contract with a
20	second vendor to provide fingerprinting services or to provide
21	fingerprinting services by other means if the department determines
22	that the original vendor has not fulfilled the contract in a
23	reasonable manner; and
24	(2) annually review and prepare a report on the

- 1 services provided by the vendor under the contract that includes a
- 2 determination on the vendor's ability to adequately address the
- 3 need for fingerprinting services throughout this state based on:
- 4 (A) the availability of fingerprinting
- 5 appointments throughout this state, including any wait times for
- 6 appointments at locations; and
- 7 (B) a study of the miles required to travel
- 8 throughout this state in order to receive fingerprinting services
- 9 and whether there are short-term or chronic gaps in coverage in
- 10 certain areas of this state.
- 11 (b) The department shall provide the report prepared under
- 12 Subsection (a)(2) to the governor and members of the legislature.
- 13 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 14 to a contract for which the Department of Public Safety of the State
- 15 of Texas first advertises or otherwise solicits bids, proposals,
- 16 offers, or qualifications or makes a similar solicitation on or
- 17 after the effective date of this Act. A contract for which the
- 18 Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas first advertises
- 19 or otherwise solicits bids, proposals, offers, or qualifications or
- 20 makes a similar solicitation before the effective date of this Act
- 21 is governed by the law in effect on the date the advertisement or
- 22 solicitation is made, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 23 purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
