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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to legislative oversight during a public health disaster 2 3 or public health emergency, including the establishment of a 4 legislative public health oversight board. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 8 SUBTITLE D. PREVENTION, CONTROL, AND REPORTS OF DISEASES; PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES 9 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 81, Health and Safety 10 Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 12 CHAPTER 81. COMMUNICABLE DISEASES; PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTERS; PUBLIC 13 HEALTH EMERGENCIES 14 SECTION 3. Section 81.003, Health and Safety Code, is 15 amended by amending Subdivision (7) and adding Subdivision (7-a) to read as follows: 16 "Public health disaster" means: (7)17 18 (A) a declaration by the governor of a state of disaster; and 19 a determination by the commissioner that 20 (B) 21 there exists an immediate threat from a communicable disease, health condition, or chemical, biological, radiological, or 22 electromagnetic exposure that: 23 24 (i) poses a high risk of death or serious

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harm [long-term disability] to the public [a large number of 1 2 people]; and (ii) creates a substantial risk of harmful 3 public exposure [because of the disease's high level of contagion 4 or the method by which the disease is transmitted]. 5 6 (7-a) "Public health emergency" means a determination 7 by the commissioner, evidenced in an emergency order issued by the commissioner, that there exists an immediate threat from a 8 communicable disease, health condition, or chemical, biological, 9 radiological, or electromagnetic exposure that: 10 11 (A) potentially poses a risk of death or severe illness or harm to the public; and 12 13 (B) potentially creates a substantial risk of harmful exposure to the public. 14 SECTION 4. The heading to Subchapter E, Chapter 81, Health 15 16 and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER E. CONTROL; PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTERS; PUBLIC HEALTH 17 18 EMERGENCIES SECTION 5. Section 81.082, Health and Safety Code, 19 is 20 amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsections (d-1) and (d-2) to read as follows: 21 22 (d) A declaration of a public health disaster or an order of public health emergency may continue for not more than 30 days after 23 the date the disaster or emergency is declared or ordered by the 24 commissioner. A public health disaster or public health emergency 25 may be renewed [one time] by the legislature or the legislative 26 public health oversight board established under Section 81.0821 27

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1 [commissioner] for an additional 30 days. Each renewal period may 2 not exceed 30 days. (d-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (d), if the legislature or 3 4 the legislative public health oversight board is unable to meet to consider renewing a declaration of a public health disaster or an 5 order of a public health emergency, the declaration or order shall 6 7 continue until the legislature or the board meets unless the declaration or order is terminated by the commissioner or the 8 9 governor. 10 (d-2) Not later than the seventh day after the date the 11 commissioner issues an initial declaration of a public health 12 disaster or an order of a public health emergency, the commissioner 13 shall consult with the chairs of the standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with primary jurisdiction over 14 public health regarding the disaster or emergency. 15 16 SECTION 6. Subchapter E, Chapter 81, Health and Safety 17 Code, is amended by adding Section 81.0821 to read as follows: Sec. 81.0821. LEGISLATIVE PUBLIC HEALTH OVERSIGHT BOARD. 18 In this section, "board" means the legislative public health 19 (a) 20 oversight board established under this section. (b) The legislative public health oversight board is 21 established to provide oversight for declarations of public health 22 disasters and orders of public health emergencies issued by the 23 commissioner under this chapter and perform other duties required 24 25 by law. (c) The board consists of the following members: 26 27 (1) the lieutenant governor;

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1	(2) the speaker of the house of representatives;
2	(3) the chair of the senate committee with primary
3	jurisdiction over public health;
4	(4) the chair of the house committee with primary
5	jurisdiction over public health;
6	(5) a member of the senate appointed by the lieutenant
7	governor; and
8	(6) a member of the house appointed by the speaker.
9	(d) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
10	representatives are joint chairs of the board.
11	(e) A majority of the members of the board from each house of
12	the legislature constitutes a quorum to transact business. If a
13	quorum is present, the board by majority vote may act on any matter
14	within the board's jurisdiction.
15	(f) The board shall meet as often as necessary to perform
16	the board's duties. Meetings may be held at any time at the request
17	of either chair or on written petition of a majority of the board
18	members from each house of the legislature.
19	(g) The board shall meet in Austin, except that if a
20	majority of the board members from each house of the legislature
21	agree, the committee may meet in any location determined by the
22	board.
23	(h) As an exception to Chapter 551, Government Code, and
24	other law, for a meeting in Austin at which both joint chairs of the
25	board are physically present, any number of the other board members
26	may attend the meeting by use of telephone conference call, video
27	conference call, or other similar telecommunication device. This

subsection applies for purposes of establishing a quorum or voting 1 2 or any other purpose allowing the members to fully participate in any board meeting. This subsection applies without regard to the 3 subject or topics considered by the members at the meeting. 4 5 (i) A board meeting held by use of telephone conference call, video conference call, or other similar telecommunication 6 7 device: 8 (1) is subject to the notice requirements applicable 9 to other meetings; 10 (2) must specify in the notice of the meeting the 11 location in Austin at which the joint chairs will be physically 12 present; 13 (3) must be open to the public and audible to the public at the location specified in the notice under Subdivision 14 15 (2); and 16 (4) must provide two-way audio communication between all board members attending the meeting during the entire meeting, 17 and if the two-way audio communication link with any member 18 attending the meeting is disrupted at any time, the meeting may not 19 20 continue until the two-way audio communication link is reestablished. 21 SECTION 7. As soon as practicable after the effective date 22

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of this Act, the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint the legislative members to the legislative public health oversight board as required by Section 81.0821, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
