S.B. No. 966

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to legislative oversight during a public health disaster
- 3 or public health emergency, including the establishment of a
- 4 legislative public health oversight board.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and
- 7 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 SUBTITLE D. PREVENTION, CONTROL, AND REPORTS OF DISEASES; PUBLIC
- 9 <u>HEALTH DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES</u>
- 10 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 81, Health and Safety
- 11 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 CHAPTER 81. COMMUNICABLE DISEASES; PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTERS; PUBLIC
- 13 <u>HEALTH EMERGENCIES</u>
- SECTION 3. Section 81.003, Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended by amending Subdivision (7) and adding Subdivision (7-a) to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (7) "Public health disaster" means:
- 18 (A) a declaration by the governor of a state of
- 19 disaster; and
- 20 (B) a determination by the commissioner that
- 21 there exists an immediate threat from a communicable disease,
- 22 health condition, or chemical, biological, radiological, or
- 23 electromagnetic exposure that:
- 24 (i) poses a high risk of death or serious

- 1 harm [long-term disability] to the public [a large number of
- 2 people]; and
- 3 (ii) creates a substantial risk of harmful
- 4 public exposure [because of the disease's high level of contagion
- 5 or the method by which the disease is transmitted].
- 6 (7-a) "Public health emergency" means a determination
- 7 by the commissioner, evidenced in an emergency order issued by the
- 8 commissioner, that there exists an immediate threat from a
- 9 communicable disease, health condition, or chemical, biological,
- 10 radiological, or electromagnetic exposure that:
- 11 (A) potentially poses a risk of death or severe
- 12 illness or harm to the public; and
- (B) potentially creates a substantial risk of
- 14 harmful exposure to the public.
- SECTION 4. The heading to Subchapter E, Chapter 81, Health
- 16 and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 SUBCHAPTER E. CONTROL; PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTERS; PUBLIC HEALTH
- 18 EMERGENCIES
- 19 SECTION 5. Section 81.082, Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsections (d-1) and
- 21 (d-2) to read as follows:
- 22 (d) A declaration of a public health disaster or an order of
- 23 public health emergency may continue for not more than 30 days after
- 24 the date the disaster or emergency is declared or ordered by the
- 25 commissioner. A public health disaster or public health emergency
- 26 may be renewed [one time] by the <u>legislature or the legislative</u>
- 27 public health oversight board established under Section 81.0821

- 1 [commissioner] for an additional 30 days. Each renewal period may
- 2 not exceed 30 days.
- 3 (d-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (d), if the legislature or
- 4 the legislative public health oversight board is unable to meet to
- 5 consider renewing a declaration of a public health disaster or an
- 6 order of a public health emergency, the declaration or order shall
- 7 continue until the legislature or the board meets unless the
- 8 declaration or order is terminated by the commissioner or the
- 9 governor.
- 10 (d-2) Not later than the seventh day after the date the
- 11 commissioner issues an initial declaration of a public health
- 12 disaster or an order of a public health emergency, the commissioner
- 13 shall consult with the chairs of the standing committees of the
- 14 senate and house of representatives with primary jurisdiction over
- 15 public health regarding the disaster or emergency.
- SECTION 6. Subchapter E, Chapter 81, Health and Safety
- 17 Code, is amended by adding Section 81.0821 to read as follows:
- 18 <u>Sec. 81.0821. LEGISLATIVE PUBLIC</u> HEALTH OVERSIGHT BOARD.
- 19 (a) In this section, "board" means the legislative public health
- 20 oversight board established under this section.
- 21 (b) The legislative public health oversight board is
- 22 established to provide oversight for declarations of public health
- 23 disasters and orders of public health emergencies issued by the
- 24 commissioner under this chapter and perform other duties required
- 25 by law.
- 26 (c) The board consists of the following members:
- 27 (1) the lieutenant governor;

- 1 (2) the speaker of the house of representatives;
- 2 (3) the chair of the senate committee with primary
- 3 jurisdiction over public health;
- 4 (4) the chair of the house committee with primary
- 5 jurisdiction over public health;
- 6 (5) a member of the senate appointed by the lieutenant
- 7 governor; and
- 8 (6) a member of the house appointed by the speaker.
- 9 <u>(d) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of</u>
 10 representatives are joint chairs of the board.
- 11 (e) A majority of the members of the board from each house of
- 12 the legislature constitutes a quorum to transact business. If a
- 13 quorum is present, the board by majority vote may act on any matter
- 14 within the board's jurisdiction.
- 15 (f) The board shall meet as often as necessary to perform
- 16 the board's duties. Meetings may be held at any time at the request
- 17 of either chair or on written petition of a majority of the board
- 18 members from each house of the legislature.
- 19 (g) The board shall meet in Austin, except that if a
- 20 majority of the board members from each house of the legislature
- 21 agree, the committee may meet in any location determined by the
- 22 board.
- (h) As an exception to Chapter 551, Government Code, and
- 24 other law, for a meeting in Austin at which both joint chairs of the
- 25 board are physically present, any number of the other board members
- 26 may attend the meeting by use of telephone conference call, video
- 27 conference call, or other similar telecommunication device. This

- 1 subsection applies for purposes of establishing a quorum or voting
- 2 or any other purpose allowing the members to fully participate in
- 3 any board meeting. This subsection applies without regard to the
- 4 subject or topics considered by the members at the meeting.
- 5 (i) A board meeting held by use of telephone conference
- 6 <u>call, video conference call, or other similar telecommunication</u>
- 7 device:
- 8 (1) is subject to the notice requirements applicable
- 9 to other meetings;
- 10 (2) must specify in the notice of the meeting the
- 11 location in Austin at which the joint chairs will be physically
- 12 present;
- 13 (3) must be open to the public and audible to the
- 14 public at the location specified in the notice under Subdivision
- 15 (2); and
- 16 (4) must provide two-way audio communication between
- 17 <u>all board members attending the meeting during the entire meeting,</u>
- 18 and if the two-way audio communication link with any member
- 19 attending the meeting is disrupted at any time, the meeting may not
- 20 continue until the two-way audio communication link is
- 21 reestablished.
- 22 SECTION 7. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 23 of this Act, the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 24 representatives shall appoint the legislative members to the
- 25 legislative public health oversight board as required by Section
- 26 81.0821, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
