A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to legislative oversight during a public health disaster,
3	including the establishment of a legislative public health
4	oversight board.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter E, Chapter 81, Health
7	and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER E. CONTROL; PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTERS
9	SECTION 2. Section 81.082, Health and Safety Code, is
10	amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to

- (d) A declaration of a public health disaster may continue
- 13 for not more than 30 days. A public health disaster may be renewed:
- 14 $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ one time by the commissioner for an additional 30
- 15 days; and

read as follows:

- 16 (2) following the initial renewal, by the commissioner
- 17 for an additional 30 days only if each subsequent renewal is
- 18 approved by the legislative public health oversight board
- 19 <u>established under Section 81.0821</u>.
- 20 <u>(d-1) Not later than the seventh day after the date the</u>
- 21 commissioner issues an initial declaration of a public health
- 22 disaster, the commissioner shall consult with the chairs of the
- 23 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 24 primary jurisdiction over public health regarding the disaster.

- 1 SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 81, Health and Safety
- 2 Code, is amended by adding Section 81.0821 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 81.0821. LEGISLATIVE PUBLIC HEALTH OVERSIGHT BOARD.
- 4 (a) In this section, "board" means the legislative public health
- 5 oversight board established under this section.
- 6 (b) The legislative public health oversight board is
- 7 established to provide oversight for declarations of public health
- 8 disasters issued by the commissioner under this chapter and perform
- 9 other duties required by law.
- 10 <u>(c) The board consists of the following members:</u>
- 11 (1) the lieutenant governor;
- 12 (2) the speaker of the house of representatives;
- 13 (3) the chair of the senate committee with primary
- 14 jurisdiction over public health;
- 15 (4) the chair of the house committee with primary
- 16 jurisdiction over public health;
- 17 (5) a member of the senate appointed by the lieutenant
- 18 governor; and
- 19 (6) a member of the house appointed by the speaker.
- 20 (d) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 21 representatives are joint chairs of the board.
- (e) A majority of the members of the board from each house of
- 23 the legislature constitutes a quorum to transact business. If a
- 24 quorum is present, the board by majority vote may act on any matter
- 25 within the board's jurisdiction.
- 26 (f) The board shall meet as often as necessary to perform
- 27 the board's duties. Meetings may be held at any time at the request

- 1 of either chair or on written petition of a majority of the board
- 2 members from each house of the legislature.
- 3 (g) The board shall meet in Austin, except that if a
- 4 majority of the board members from each house of the legislature
- 5 agree, the committee may meet in any location determined by the
- 6 board.
- 7 (h) As an exception to Chapter 551, Government Code, and
- 8 other law, for a meeting in Austin at which both joint chairs of the
- 9 board are physically present, any number of the other board members
- 10 may attend the meeting by use of telephone conference call, video
- 11 conference call, or other similar telecommunication device. This
- 12 subsection applies for purposes of establishing a quorum or voting
- 13 or any other purpose allowing the members to fully participate in
- 14 any board meeting. This subsection applies without regard to the
- 15 <u>subject or topics considered by the members at the meeting.</u>
- (i) A board meeting held by use of telephone conference
- 17 <u>call, video conference call, or other similar telecommunication</u>
- 18 device:
- 19 (1) is subject to the notice requirements applicable
- 20 to other meetings;
- 21 (2) must specify in the notice of the meeting the
- 22 location in Austin at which the joint chairs will be physically
- 23 present;
- 24 (3) must be open to the public and audible to the
- 25 public at the location specified in the notice under Subdivision
- 26 (2); and
- 27 (4) must provide two-way audio communication between

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- 1 all board members attending the meeting during the entire meeting,
- 2 and if the two-way audio communication link with any member
- 3 attending the meeting is disrupted at any time, the meeting may not
- 4 continue until the two-way audio communication link is
- 5 <u>reestablished.</u>
- 6 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 7 of this Act, the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 8 representatives shall appoint the legislative members to the
- 9 legislative public health oversight board as required by Section
- 10 81.0821, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
