Section 1701.660(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 A [Except as provided by Subsections (a-1) and (b), a] 7 (a) recording created with a body worn camera and documenting an 8 incident that involves the use of deadly force by a peace officer or 9 that is otherwise related to an administrative or criminal 10 investigation of <u>a peace</u> [an] officer may not be deleted <u>or</u> $[\tau]$ 11 12 destroyed[, or released to the public] until all criminal matters have been finally adjudicated and all related administrative 13 14 investigations have concluded. SECTION 2. Sections 1701.661(e) and (f), Occupations Code, 15 are amended to read as follows: 16 (e) A law enforcement agency may: 17 18 (1) seek to withhold information [<del>subject to</del> Subsection (d)] in accordance with procedures provided by Section 19 552.301, Government Code; 20 21 (2) assert any exceptions to disclosure in Chapter 22 552, Government Code, or other law; or (3) release information requested in accordance with 23 Subsection (a) after the agency redacts any information made 24

1 confidential under Chapter 552, Government Code, or other law. 2 <u>Any</u> [A law enforcement agency may not release any] (f) 3 portion of a recording made in a private space is confidential and excepted from the requirements of Chapter 552, Government Code, and 4 5 may not be released [, or of a recording involving the investigation 6 of conduct that constitutes a misdemeanor punishable by fine only 7 and does not result in arrest, ] without written authorization from 8 the person who is the subject of that portion of the recording or, 9 if the person is deceased, from the person's authorized 10 representative.

SECTION 3. The following provisions of the Occupations Code are repealed:

(1) Sections 1701.660(a-1), (b), and (c); and

(2) Sections 1701.661(c), (d), and (h).

15 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act relating to 16 the release of body worn camera recordings apply to a request for 17 release of a recording received on or after the effective date of 18 this Act. A request for release of a recording received before the 19 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 20 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in 21 effect for that purpose.
