S.B. No. 979

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the indicator of achievement for military readiness 3 under the public school accountability system. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 39.053(c), Education Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: 7 School districts and campuses must be evaluated based on (c) three domains of indicators of achievement adopted under this 8 section that include: 9 10 (1)in the student achievement domain, indicators of student achievement that must include: 11 12 (A) for evaluating the performance of districts 13 and campuses generally: 14 (i) an indicator that accounts for the 15 results of assessment instruments required under Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (l), as applicable for the district and campus, 16 including the results of assessment instruments required for 17 graduation retaken by a student, aggregated across grade levels by 18 subject area, including: 19 (a) for performance 20 the standard 21 determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), the 22 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject 23 24 area; and

1 (b) for the college readiness 2 performance standard as determined under Section 39.0241, the 3 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the 4 assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject 5 area; and

(ii) an indicator that accounts for the 6 7 of assessment instruments required under results Section 39.023(b), as applicable for the district and campus, including the 8 9 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the assessment instruments, as determined by the performance standard 10 11 adopted by the agency, aggregated across grade levels by subject 12 area; and

(B) for evaluating the performance of high school
campuses and districts that include high school campuses,
indicators that account for:

(i) students who satisfy the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument in reading or mathematics designated by the coordinating board under that section;

(ii) students who satisfy relevant performance standards on advanced placement tests or similar assessments;

 26 (iv) students who [enlist in the armed

27 forces of the United States] demonstrate military readiness by:

1 (a) achieving the minimum required passing score on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery 2 test for purposes of enlistment in the armed forces of the United 3 4 States; 5 (v) students who earn industry certifications; 6 7 (vi) students admitted into postsecondary industry certification programs that require as a prerequisite for 8 9 entrance successful performance at the secondary level; 10 (vii) students whose successful completion of a course or courses under Section 28.014 indicates the student's 11 preparation to enroll and succeed, without remediation, in an 12 entry-level general education course for a baccalaureate degree or 13 14 associate degree; 15 (viii) students who successfully met 16 standards on a composite of indicators that through research indicates the student's preparation to enroll and succeed, without 17 remediation, in an entry-level general education course for a 18 baccalaureate degree or associate degree; 19 (ix) high school graduation rates, computed 20 in accordance with standards and definitions adopted in compliance 21 with the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) 22 subject to the exclusions provided by Subsections (g), (g-1), 23 24 (q-2), and (q-3); 25 (x) students who successfully completed an OnRamps dual enrollment course; 26 27 (xi) students who successfully completed a

practicum or internship approved by the State Board of Education; 1 2 and (xii) students who are awarded an associate 3 4 degree; 5 (2) in the school progress domain, indicators for effectiveness in promoting student learning, which must include: 6 7 (A) for assessment instruments, including assessment instruments under Subdivisions (1)(A)(i) and (ii), the 8 9 percentage of students who met the standard for improvement, as determined by the commissioner; and 10 11 (B) for evaluating relative performance, the 12 performance of districts and campuses compared to similar districts 13 or campuses; and in the closing the gaps domain, the use of 14 (3) 15 disaggregated data to demonstrate the differentials among students 16 from different racial and ethnic groups, socioeconomic backgrounds, and other factors, including: 17 18 (A) students formerly receiving special education services; 19 20 (B) students continuously enrolled; and students who are mobile. 21 (C) 22 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 school year. 23 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

1 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
