A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
3	program for certain public elementary school campuses.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 38, Education Code, is

- 6 amended by adding Section 38.3515 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 38.3515. SUICIDE PREVENTION, INTERVENTION, AND
- 8 POSTVENTION PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "postvention" includes
- 9 activities that promote healing necessary to reduce the risk of
- 10 <u>suicide by a person affected by the suicide of another.</u>
- 11 (b) To the extent funds are appropriated to the agency for
- 12 that purpose, the agency shall establish a suicide prevention,
- 13 intervention, and postvention program for optional implementation
- 14 at an elementary school campus of a school district described by
- 15 Subsection (c).
- 16 (c) A school district may implement the program established
- 17 under this section at a campus of the district if the district or
- 18 campus has:
- (1) experienced suicide loss among elementary school
- 20 students enrolled in the district; or
- 21 (2) a reasonable concern regarding the risk of suicide
- 22 among elementary school students enrolled in the district.
- 23 (d) The agency may prioritize school districts described by
- 24 Subsection (c)(1).

1	(e) For each elementary school campus at which the program
2	is implemented, the agency shall:
3	(1) conduct:
4	(A) an eligibility assessment of whether a
5	district that implements the program meets the criteria provided
6	under Subsection (c); and
7	(B) a needs-based assessment to identify
8	individual needs of each campus in the program;
9	(2) provide, in coordination with the Health and Human
10	Services Commission, comprehensive Suicide Safer Early
11	<pre>Intervention and Prevention systems for each campus in the program;</pre>
12	(3) provide recommendations for research-based best
13	practices for suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
14	policies;
15	(4) develop a method for eligible districts to request
16	the assistance of public and private community-based mental health
17	resources;
18	(5) ensure that informational materials distributed
19	by an eligible district are age-appropriate and evidence-based; and
20	(6) at the request of an eligible district, provide
21	support to the campus in the program, including by:
22	(A) identifying the individual needs of the
23	campus through the assessment conducted under Subdivision (1)(B);
24	(B) implementing research-based best practices
25	for suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention; and
26	(C) working with mental health professionals,
27	school counselors, teachers, nurses, administrators, and other

- 1 staff, as well as law enforcement officers and social workers who
- 2 regularly interact with students, to prevent suicide among students
- 3 enrolled at the campus.
- 4 (f) Each school district that implements the program under
- 5 this section shall provide written notice to a parent or guardian of
- 6 each student enrolled at a campus in the program. The required
- 7 written notice must include:
- 8 (1) current information on suicide rates;
- 9 (2) evidence-based informational materials
- 10 identifying strategies to recognize the signs and symptoms of
- 11 possible suicidal ideation that are age-appropriate for children
- 12 who are three years of age or older;
- 13 (3) information about suicide prevention strategies
- 14 involving restricting access to the means of suicide; and
- 15 (4) a list of available school and community resources
- 16 to support students or community members who may be at risk for
- 17 suicide.
- 18 (g) In developing the program under this section, the
- 19 agency, in consultation with the Health and Human Services
- 20 Commission, shall make the considerations described by Section
- 21 <u>38.351(f)</u>.
- (h) In addition to the policies and procedures developed by
- 23 <u>a school district under Section 38.351(i)</u>, a district that
- 24 implements the program shall develop practices and procedures
- 25 concerning suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention that:
- 26 (1) include a procedure for providing notice to a
- 27 parent or guardian of a student regarding a recommendation for

   a parent or guardian of the student within a reasonable amount of

   signs listed in Subdivision (1);

               (3) designate at least one person to act as a liaison
   officer in the district for the purposes of identifying students in
18
   need of suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention;

               (4) provide information concerning available
21
   counseling alternatives to parents and guardians of district
   students to consider when a student is identified as possibly in
22
   need of suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention; and
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               (5) include procedures to support the return of a
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   student to regular school attendance following hospitalization or

   residential treatment for a mental health condition or substance
27
   abuse.
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- 1 (i) The practices and procedures developed under Subsection
- 2 (h) must be included in:
- 3 (1) the annual student handbook; and
- 4 (2) the district improvement plan under Section
- 5 11.252.
- 6 (j) The agency:
- 7 (1) may accept donations for purposes of this section
- 8 from sources without a conflict of interest; and
- 9 (2) may not accept donations for purposes of this
- 10 section from an anonymous source.
- 11 (k) Nothing in this section is intended to interfere with
- 12 the rights of parents or guardians and the decision-making
- 13 regarding the best interest of the child. Practices and procedures
- 14 developed in accordance with this section are intended to notify a
- 15 parent or guardian of a need for suicide prevention, intervention,
- 16 or postvention so that a parent or guardian may take appropriate
- 17 action.
- 18 (1) Nothing in this section authorizes a school district
- 19 employee to recommend prescription medication for a student or to
- 20 interfere with medical decisions to be made by the student's parent
- 21 or guardian.
- 22 <u>(m) The commissioner shall adopt rules to administer this</u>
- 23 section.
- 24 (n) This section expires September 1, 2025.
- 25 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 26 school year.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
