A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the removal of a vacated protective order from the
- 3 protective order registry maintained by the Office of Court
- 4 Administration of the Texas Judicial System.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 72.154(b), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:

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- 8 (b) Publicly accessible information regarding each
- 9 protective order must consist of the following:
- 10 (1) the court that issued the protective order;
- 11 (2) the case number;
- 12 (3) the full name, county of residence, birth year,
- 13 and race or ethnicity of the person who is the subject of the
- 14 protective order;
- 15 (4) the dates the protective order was issued and
- 16 served; and
- 17 (5) [the date the protective order was vacated, if
- 18 applicable; and
- 19 $\left[\frac{(6)}{(6)}\right]$ the date the protective order expired or will
- 20 expire, as applicable.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 72.155(a), Government Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The registry must include a copy of each application for
- 24 a protective order filed in this state and a copy of each protective

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- 1 order issued in this state, including \underline{an} [a vacated or] expired
- 2 order. Only an authorized user, the attorney general, a district
- 3 attorney, a criminal district attorney, a county attorney, a
- 4 municipal attorney, or a peace officer may access that information
- 5 under the registry.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 72.157, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) For a protective order [that is vacated or] that has
- 10 expired, the clerk of the applicable court shall modify the record
- 11 of the order in the registry to reflect the order's status as
- 12 [vacated or] expired.
- 13 (b-1) For a protective order that is vacated, the clerk of
- 14 the applicable court shall remove the record of the order from the
- 15 <u>registry.</u>
- SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 17 of this Act, the Office of Court Administration of the Texas
- 18 Judicial System shall remove the record of any protective orders
- 19 that have been vacated from the protective order registry
- 20 established under Subchapter F, Chapter 72, Government Code, as
- 21 amended by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
