- 2 relating to motor vehicle accidents involving a vulnerable road
- 3 user within the area of a crosswalk and to requiring the operator of
- 4 a vehicle to yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian; creating a
- 5 criminal offense.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Lisa Torry Smith
- 8 Act.
- 9 SECTION 2. Subchapter I, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
- 10 is amended by adding Section 545.428 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 545.428. MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT INVOLVING PEDESTRIAN
- 12 OR OTHER VULNERABLE ROAD USER WITHIN AREA OF CROSSWALK; OFFENSE.
- 13 (a) In this section:
- 14 (1) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" has
- 15 the meaning assigned by Section 551.201.
- 16 (2) "Golf cart" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 17 551.401.
- 18 (3) "Motor-assisted scooter" has the meaning assigned
- 19 by Section 551.351.
- 20 (4) "Neighborhood electric vehicle" has the meaning
- 21 <u>assigned by Section 551.301.</u>
- 22 (b) A person commits an offense if the person with criminal
- 23 negligence:
- 24 (1) operates a motor vehicle within the area of a

## 1 crosswalk; and

- 2 (2) causes bodily injury to a pedestrian or a person
- 3 operating a bicycle, motor-assisted scooter, electronic personal
- 4 assistive mobility device, neighborhood electric vehicle, or golf
- 5 cart.
- 6 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor,
- 7 except that the offense is a state jail felony if the person
- 8 <u>described by Subsection (b)(2) suffered serious bodily injury.</u>
- 9 (d) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this
- 10 section that, at the time of the offense, the person described by
- 11 Subsection (b)(2) was violating a provision of this subtitle
- 12 relating to walking, movement, or operation in a crosswalk or on a
- 13 roadway.
- 14 (e) If conduct that constitutes an offense under this
- 15 section also constitutes an offense under any other law, the actor
- 16 may be prosecuted under this section, the other law, or both.
- SECTION 3. Sections 544.007(b) and (c), Transportation
- 18 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 19 (b) An operator of a vehicle facing a circular green signal
- 20 may proceed straight or turn right or left unless a sign prohibits
- 21 the turn. The operator shall, while the signal is exhibited:
- 22 <u>(1)</u> yield the right-of-way to other vehicles [and to
- 23 pedestrians] lawfully in the intersection [or an adjacent
- 24 crosswalk] when the signal is exhibited; and
- 25 (2) stop and yield the right-of-way to pedestrians
- 26 lawfully in the intersection or an adjacent crosswalk.
- (c) An operator of a vehicle facing a green arrow signal,

- 1 displayed alone or with another signal, may cautiously enter the
- 2 intersection to move in the direction permitted by the arrow or
- 3 other indication shown simultaneously. The operator shall stop and
- 4 yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian lawfully in an adjacent
- 5 crosswalk and shall yield the right-of-way to other traffic
- 6 lawfully using the intersection.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 552.002(b), Transportation Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (b) A pedestrian facing a "Walk" signal may proceed across a
- 10 roadway in the direction of the signal, and the operator of a
- 11 vehicle shall stop and yield the right-of-way to the pedestrian.
- 12 SECTION 5. Sections 552.003(a) and (b), Transportation
- 13 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The operator of a vehicle shall stop and yield the
- 15 right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing a roadway in a crosswalk if:
- 16 (1) no traffic control signal is in place or in
- 17 operation; and
- 18 (2) the pedestrian is:
- 19 (A) on the half of the roadway in which the
- 20 vehicle is traveling; or
- 21 (B) approaching so closely from the opposite half
- 22 of the roadway as to be in danger.
- 23 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a pedestrian may not
- 24 suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and proceed into a
- 25 crosswalk in the path of a vehicle so close that it is impossible
- 26 for the vehicle operator to stop and yield.
- 27 SECTION 6. Section 552.006(c), Transportation Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (c) The operator of a vehicle emerging from or entering an
- 3 alley, building, or private road or driveway shall stop and yield
- 4 the right-of-way to a pedestrian approaching on a sidewalk
- 5 extending across the alley, building entrance or exit, road, or
- 6 driveway.
- 7 SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 12 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 14 committed before that date.
- 15 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
