A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to parental access to curriculum materials used in a
- 3 public school's human sexuality instruction.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 26.006(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A parent is entitled to:
- 8 (1) review all teaching materials, instructional
- 9 materials, and other teaching aids used in the classroom of the
- 10 parent's child, including curriculum materials used in any human
- 11 sexuality instruction provided to the child; and
- 12 (2) review each test administered to the parent's
- 13 child after the test is administered.
- 14 (c) A student's parent is entitled to request that the
- 15 school district or open-enrollment charter school the student
- 16 attends allow the student to take home any instructional materials
- 17 used by the student. Subject to the availability of the
- 18 instructional materials, the district or school shall honor the
- 19 request. A student who takes home instructional materials must
- 20 return the instructional materials to school at the beginning of
- 21 the next school day if requested to do so by the student's teacher.
- 22 A school district or open-enrollment charter school must provide
- 23 the instructional materials to the student in printed format if the
- 24 student does not have reliable access to technology at the

- 1 student's home. In this subsection, "instructional material" has
- 2 the meaning assigned by Section 31.002 and includes curriculum
- 3 materials used in the district's or school's human sexuality
- 4 <u>instruction</u>.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 28.004(i), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (i) Before each school year, a school district shall provide
- 8 written notice to a parent of each student enrolled in the district
- 9 of the board of trustees' decision regarding whether the district
- 10 will provide human sexuality instruction to district students. If
- 11 instruction will be provided, the notice must include:
- 12 (1) a summary of the basic content of the district's
- 13 human sexuality instruction to be provided to the student,
- 14 including a statement informing the parent of the instructional
- 15 requirements under state law;
- 16 (2) a statement of the parent's right to:
- 17 (A) review curriculum materials as provided by
- 18 Section 26.006 [Subsection (j)]; and
- 19 (B) remove the student from any part of the
- 20 district's human sexuality instruction without subjecting the
- 21 student to any disciplinary action, academic penalty, or other
- 22 sanction imposed by the district or the student's school; and
- 23 (3) information describing the opportunities for
- 24 parental involvement in the development of the curriculum to be
- 25 used in human sexuality instruction, including information
- 26 regarding the local school health advisory council established
- 27 under Subsection (a).

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 28.004(j), Education Code, is repealed.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 3 school year.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
