4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 100A to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 100A. UTERINE FIBROID EDUCATION AND RESEARCH
8	Sec. 100A.001. UTERINE FIBROID DATABASE. (a) The
9	department's Center for Health Statistics shall establish and
10	maintain an electronic database of information related to uterine
11	fibroids to increase awareness about uterine fibroids and ensure
12	women receive the information and health care necessary to prevent
13	and treat the condition. The database must include the:
14	(1) incidence and prevalence of uterine fibroids in
15	this state;
16	(2) demographic attributes of women diagnosed with
17	uterine fibroids; and
18	(3) treatments for uterine fibroids used by health
19	care providers.
20	(b) A health care provider who diagnoses or treats a woman
21	with uterine fibroids shall submit for inclusion in the
22	department's Center for Health Statistics the information required
23	by the center in the form and manner prescribed by the department.
24	The information provided under this section may be combined with

1	other information the health care provider submits to the
2	department under other law.
3	(c) Information regarding a woman who is diagnosed with or
4	treated for uterine fibroids that is maintained in the database
5	under Subsection (a):
6	(1) may not include any personally identifying
7	information of the woman; and
8	(2) is confidential and may be used only by the
9	department or other person on behalf of the department for uterine
10	fibroid research.
11	Sec. 100A.002. UTERINE FIBROID EDUCATION OUTREACH. The
12	department, in consultation with the Texas Medical Association,
13	shall develop and disseminate to health care providers information
14	on uterine fibroids and conduct a campaign to increase public
15	awareness of uterine fibroids, including information on and
16	awareness of the:
17	(1) women of a race or ethnicity that has a
18	statistically elevated risk of developing uterine fibroids; and
19	(2) range of available treatment options for uterine
20	fibroids that include non-hysterectomy treatments and procedures.
21	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
