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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the automatic admission of students to general academic teaching institutions. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 51.803(a-1), (a-2), and (a-6), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a-1) Beginning with admissions for the 2<u>025-2026</u> [2011-2012] academic year, a general academic teaching institution 8 [The University of Texas at Austin] is not required to offer 9 admission to applicants who qualify for automatic admission under 10 11 Subsection (a) in excess of the number required to fill 30 [75] percent of the <u>institution's</u> [university's] enrollment capacity 12 designated for first-time resident undergraduate students in an 13 14 academic year. If the number of applicants who qualify for automatic admission to the institution [The University of Texas at 15 16 Austin] under Subsection (a) for an academic year exceeds 30 [75] percent of the <u>institution's</u> [university's] enrollment capacity 17 designated for first-time resident undergraduate students for that 18 academic year, the institution [university] may elect to offer 19 admission to those applicants as provided by this subsection and 20 not as otherwise required by Subsection (a). If the institution 21 [university] elects to offer admission under this subsection, the 22 23 institution [university] shall offer admission to those applicants by percentile rank according to high school graduating class 24

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1 standing based on grade point average, beginning with the top percentile rank, until the applicants qualified under Subsection 2 3 (a) have been offered admission in the number estimated in good faith by the institution [university] as sufficient to fill 30 [75] 4 percent of the institution's [university's] enrollment capacity 5 designated for first-time resident undergraduate students, except 6 that the institution [university] must offer admission to all 7 8 applicants with the same percentile rank. After the applicants qualified for automatic admission under Subsection (a) have been 9 offered admission under this subsection in the number estimated in 10 good faith as sufficient to fill at least 30 [75] percent of the 11 designated enrollment capacity described by this subsection, the 12 institution [university] shall consider any remaining applicants 13 14 qualified for automatic admission under Subsection (a) in the same 15 manner as other applicants for admission as first-time undergraduate students in accordance with Section 51.805. 16

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17 (a-2) If the number of applicants who apply to a general academic teaching institution during the current academic year for 18 19 admission in the next academic year and who qualify for automatic admission to a general academic teaching institution under 20 Subsection (a) exceeds 30 [75] percent of the institution's 21 enrollment capacity designated for first-time 22 resident 23 undergraduate students for that next academic year and the 24 institution plans to offer admission under Subsection (a-1) during the next school year, the institution shall, in the manner 25 26 prescribed by the Texas Education Agency and not later than September 15, provide to each school district, for dissemination of 27

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1 the information to high school junior-level students and their 2 parents, notice of which percentile ranks of high school 3 senior-level students who qualify for automatic admission under 4 Subsection (a) are anticipated by the institution to be offered 5 admission under Subsection (a-1) during the next school year.

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6 (a-6) Not later than December 31 of each academic year in 7 which <u>a general academic teaching institution</u> [The University of 8 Texas at Austin] offers admission under Subsection (a-1), the 9 <u>institution</u> [university] shall deliver a written report to the 10 governor, the lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of 11 representatives regarding the <u>institution's</u> [university's] 12 progress in each of the following matters:

13 (1) increasing geographic diversity of the entering14 freshman class;

15 (2) counseling and outreach efforts aimed at students16 qualified for automatic admission under this section;

17 (3) recruiting Texas residents who graduate from other 18 institutions of higher education to the <u>institution's</u> 19 [<u>university's</u>] graduate and professional degree programs;

20 (4) recruiting students who are members of 21 underrepresented demographic segments of the state's population; 22 and

(5) assessing and improving the <u>institution's</u>
[university's] regional recruitment <u>efforts</u> [centers].

25 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply 26 beginning with admissions to a general academic teaching 27 institution for the 2025-2026 academic year. Admissions to a

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1 general academic teaching institution for an academic period before
2 that academic year are governed by the law in effect immediately
3 before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is
4 continued in effect for that purpose.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
