5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Section 28.010, Education Code,
7	is amended to read as follows:
8	Sec. 28.010. NOTIFICATION REGARDING COLLEGE CREDIT AND
9	WORK-BASED EDUCATION PROGRAMS.
10	SECTION 2. Section 28.010(a), Education Code, is amended to
11	read as follows:
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- 12 (a) Each school year, a school district shall notify the
- 13 parent of each district student enrolled in grade nine or above of:
- 14 (1) the availability of:
- 15 $\underline{\text{(A)}}$ programs in the district under which a
- 16 student may earn college credit, including advanced placement
- 17 programs, dual credit programs, joint high school and college
- 18 credit programs, and international baccalaureate programs;
- 19 (B) career and technology education programs or
- 20 other work-based education programs in the district, including any
- 21 internship, externship, or apprenticeship programs or a P-TECH
- 22 program under Subchapter N, Chapter 29; and
- (C) subsidies based on financial need available
- 24 for fees paid to take college advanced placement tests or

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- 1 international baccalaureate examinations under Section 28.054; and
- 2 (2) the qualifications for enrolling in programs
- 3 <u>described by Subdivision (1)(A) or (B)</u>.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
