2	relating to the creation and administration of the On-The-Ground
3	Conservation Program by the State Soil and Water Conservation

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 201, Agriculture Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER J. ON-THE-GROUND CONSERVATION PROGRAM
9	Sec. 201.351. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

- 10 (1) "Priority conservation measure" means a priority
 11 soil and water conservation land improvement measure designated
 12 under Section 201.355.
- 13 (2) "Program" means the On-The-Ground Conservation
 14 Program.
- (3) "Soil health characteristics" means the physical, chemical, and biological characteristics of soil for optimal production, including lower bulk density, good gas exchange, lower surface temperature during growing season, high cation exchange capacity, high soil organic matter, and active soil microorganisms.

 Sec. 201.352. CREATION OF PROGRAM. The state board may
- develop and administer the program to maximize public benefits by facilitating priority conservation measures and other soil and
- 23 water conservation land improvement measures by landowners and
- 24 operators in this state.

1	Sec. 201.353. PROGRAM FUNCTIONS. (a) The state board may
2	provide through the program:
3	(1) technical assistance;
4	(2) cost-share assistance;
5	(3) direct grants; and
6	(4) help in obtaining technical assistance,
7	cost-share assistance, and direct grants from other public or
8	<pre>private sources.</pre>
9	(b) The state board may create rules, forms, and procedures
10	necessary for the administration of the program.
11	(c) The state board may:
12	(1) obtain grants, cost-sharing assistance, or other
13	<pre>forms of funding from other state or federal governmental entities;</pre>
14	(2) coordinate, receive, and use gifts, grants, and
15	donations from private sources;
16	(3) work with qualified nonprofit organizations and
17	universities to provide technical assistance; and
18	(4) designate one or more conservation districts to
19	administer the program locally.
20	Sec. 201.354. PROGRAM COST-SHARE RATES. The state board
21	may establish cost-share rates for eligible soil and water
22	conservation land improvement measures under the program.
23	Sec. 201.355. PRIORITY CONSERVATION MEASURES. (a) The
24	state board may designate and give priority under the program to
25	priority conservation measures that maximize public benefits to the
26	state. Priority conservation measures include measures that:
27	(1) improve soil health characteristics;

1	(2) conserve and manage water resources;
2	(3) prevent and manage flooding;
3	(4) control invasive and nuisance species;
4	(5) improve resilience to weather extremes, climate
5	variability, and natural disasters;
6	(6) protect and enhance native habitats, including the
7	protection of endangered species;
8	(7) mitigate and reduce soil erosion;
9	(8) restore land damaged by development; and
10	(9) sequester carbon to provide environmental
11	benefits.
12	(b) The state board may:
13	(1) establish standards and specifications for each
14	priority conservation measure designated under this section; and
15	(2) consider local priorities and needs in designating
16	a priority conservation measure under this section.
17	Sec. 201.356. CERTIFICATION. The state board may provide
18	certification that specific soil and water conservation land
19	improvement measures have been implemented in accordance with any
20	standards and specifications established under Section 201.355(b).
21	Sec. 201.357. REPORT. The state board shall include
22	information regarding the program's activities in the annual report
23	required by Section 201.028.
24	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
