1 AN ACT relating to the provision of certain massage therapy instruction 2 3 using distance learning. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 455.156, Occupations Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 7 follows: (b) 8 An applicant for a license under this section must be an individual and: 9 10 (1)present evidence satisfactory to the department that the person has satisfactorily completed massage therapy 11 12 studies in a 500-hour minimum, supervised course of instruction in 13 a manner provided by Subsection (c) [provided by a massage therapy instructor at a massage school, a licensed massage school, a 14 15 state-approved educational institution, or any combination of instructors or schools], in which at least: 16 200 hours are taught by a licensed massage 17 (A) therapy instructor and dedicated to the study of massage therapy 18 techniques and theory and the practice of manipulation of soft 19 tissue, with at least 125 hours dedicated to the study of Swedish 20 21 massage therapy techniques; 22 (B) 50 hours are dedicated to the study of 23 anatomy; 24 (C) 25 hours are dedicated to the study of

physiology; 1 2 (D) 50 hours are dedicated to the study of 3 kinesiology; 4 (E) 40 hours are dedicated to the study of 5 pathology; 6 (F) of 20 hours are dedicated to the study 7 hydrotherapy; (G) hours are dedicated to 8 45 the study of 9 massage therapy laws and rules, business practices, and professional ethics standards; 10 11 (H) 20 hours are dedicated to the study of hygiene, first aid, universal precautions, 12 health, and 13 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); and 14 (I) 50 hours are spent in an internship program; 15 (2) pass the required examinations; and 16 (3) be at least 18 years of age. 17 (c) The hours of instruction required by Subsection (b) must be provided by a massage therapy instructor at a massage school, 18 licensed massage school, state-approved educational institution, 19 20 or any combination of instructors or schools. The hours of instruction required by Subsections (b)(1)(B)-(H) may be provided 21 using distance learning. Distance learning is not limited to live 22 23 instruction. 24 SECTION 2. An applicant for a massage therapist license may

25 satisfy the requirements of Sections 455.156(b)(1)(B)-(H), 26 Occupations Code, using distance learning as provided by Section 27 455.156(c), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, regardless of

whether the application is submitted before, on, or after the
effective date of this Act.

3 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas 4 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules necessary 5 to implement the changes in law made by this Act.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
